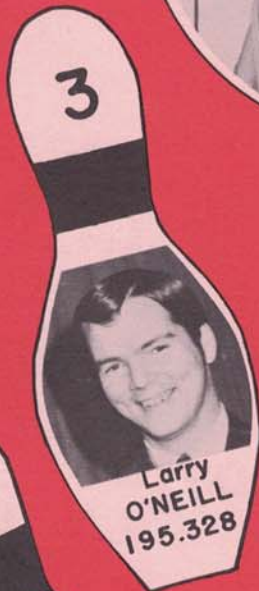

# Top Ranked Bowlers in Nation's Capital

The Washington City Tenpin Bowling Association Ranking Committee announced the results of its ranking of the top bowlers of the area at the annual meeting of the Association. For the fourth season in a row, Jim Robinette has been declared the number one bowler in the WCTBA with a composite league and tournament average of 201.938. This is Jimmy's highest finishing average. Mike Hahn finished the 1969-70 season in second place as he did a year ago. Mike's average was 199.729. Larry O'Neill, who finished in 4th place in 1967-68 season, was third in the 1969-70 season with 195.328.

Five new bowlers finished in the top ten for the 1969-70 season. Don Caniglia was fourth at 194.821, Mal Evans was fifth with 194.160, Hank Aragaki was fifth with 192.754,

Vince Larroque was 8th with 192.514 and Rube Scheidt was 10th with 191.623.

Wall Fry finished seventh with an average of 192.632, the same position he was in for the 1967-68 season.

Earl Engleman was named to the top ten for the third year with a 191.681 and a ninth place finish. In 1968-69 Buddy was 3rd and in 1967-68 he finished sixth.

Bob Rothgeb, the only other bowler in the top ten with Robinette for the first three years of ranking, in 9th place twice and 5th place once, did not make the select group this season. Bob finished with 189.292 in 17th place.

Seventy two bowlers with averages over 180 qualified for ranking in the just past 1969-70 season. In order to be considered for ranking,

a bowler must roll a minimum of 210 games consisting of 160 league games and 20 tournament games plus an additional 30 games either league or tournament or both. Seventy of the league games must be bowled in a bowling center other than the bowler's "Home" lanes. Leagues and tournaments must be sanctioned through the WCTBA.

In addition to the league games reported by the league secretaries, the following tournaments were used to determine the bowler's ranking position: Southern Printers Tournament, Fair Lanes Summer Tour; Bowl America Topper Classic; Nation's Capital Singles Classic; BOWL Magazine Tournament; WCTBA City Championship Tournament, Tournament of the Month (Tenpin Coliseum); and the MWBPA Invitational Tournament.
