

# CANTRELL AND EVANS FAIR LANE'S SUMMER TOUR CHAMPIONS

The annual Fairlanes summer tour for 1969 ended with the Washington area coming out on top for the second consecutive year. The finals were held at Fairlanes, Laurel, Md. during the weekend of 6-7 September with the team of Barbara Evans and Donald Cantrell of Springfield, Va. walking off with first place honors in the Washington area. The champions went on to win the inter-city championship between Washington and Baltimore.

Sixteen teams, each winners of one the sixteen tour stops during the summer tour, competed for over two thousand dollars in prize money. The Washington portion of the roll-off had the following results: Barbara Evans — Donald Cantrell \$717.20 plus additional \$250.00 in inter-city rolloff, Jean Kunz — Edd Cook \$458.60, Betty Cook — Jack Bowie \$193.40, Shirley Jones — Mal Evans \$193.40, Jo Ann Strickland — Buddy Beasley \$132.58, Dorothy Williams — Howard Ramsey \$132.58, Marlene Pavlo — Tony Pavlo \$132.58, Pat Castello — Mike Hahn \$132.58. The remaining Eight teams won \$20.00 dollars each: Mary Lizzio — Thomas Pauletti, Marie Mountain — Jim Mountain, Barbara Norris — Luther Cowan, Rusty Howard — Dick Hilleary, Kim Fenner — Stan Fenner, Charlotte O'Neill — Larry O'Neill, Shirley Nevitt — Leroy Johnson and Regina Walker — James Lizzio.

At the end of the first round eight pairs were eliminated. Cut were Stan and Kim Finner (804), Larry and Charlotte O'Neil (795), Jim and Maria Mountain (763), Barb Norris and Luther Cowan (744), Mary Lizzo and Tom Pauletti (741), Rusty Howard and Dick Hilleary (736), Regina Walker and Jim Lizzio (730) and Shirley Newitt and Leroy Johnson (727).

Eliminated in the second round were Dotty Williams and Howard Ramsey (739), Pat Costello and Mike Hahn (731), Marlene and Tony Pavlo (731) and JoAnn Strickland and Buddy Beasley.

Dropped in the semi-finals were Shir-

ley Jones and Mal Evans (822) and Betty Cook and Jack Bowie (743).

In the finals, Barbara Evans and Don Cantrell (869) defeated Jean Kunz and Ed Cook (777) to take the top prize of \$717.20. The losers collected \$458.60.

The Washington Champions went on to defeat Lorryne Czebotar and Al Wolfe, the Baltimore winners 1241 to 1064. The victory was worth an additional \$250 with \$150 going to the losers.

Individual and team scratch records for the Washington contingent were High Game Woman — Betty Cook 278, High

Game Man — Mike Hahn 299, High Series Woman — Betty Cook 693, High Series Man — Mike Hahn 701.

The summer tour entries for the Washington area for the 1969 season totaled 2,453 with \$13,246.20 paid out in weekly prize money.

Past overall winners of the Fairlanes Summer Tour were (1968) Peggy and Ernie Jones (Washington), (1967) Barbara and Paul Divine (Baltimore), (1966) Leni McConchie — Bill Carty (Baltimore) and (1965) Maddy Bromley — Dick Bromley (Washington).
