

Youth Bowlers Place Second At Detroit Games

The 12 youth bowlers who represented Washington, D. C. in the Youth Games at Detroit lost their championship but pulled out a second place finish with enough points to make Washington the overall winner again for the second year in a row.

The track and field squad finished in first place, the bowlers finished in second place, and the basketball team finished further down the line in fifth.

Tom Lizzio, bowling in the 12-13 age group, came away the only winner among the bowlers. Tom rolled a 12-game total of 2132 for a 177 average.

Jody Moten, also in the 12-13 age group finished second among the girls with a 12-game total of 1870 for a 155.1 average.
