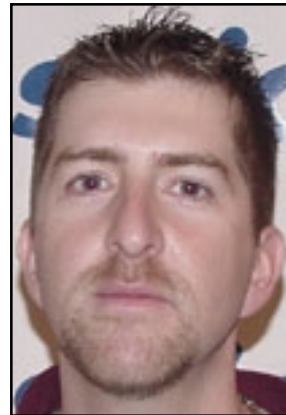

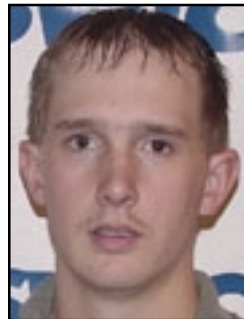

Chip off the Hall of Fame Block



Super Bowl Mini Eliminator bowlers at the Gold Coast may have noticed a very familiar name in the standings – John Petraglia. What they may not have noticed is the ‘Jr.’ following that famous bowling name.

John Petraglia Jr. is competing in his first Mini Eliminator tournament, and his famous father, Johnny Petraglia, is behind him with every shot rolled. And it only took 18-year-old John two squads to make the finals. After rolling a 601 in his first squad, he came back with games of 259, 267 and 202 to qualify for the finals with a fine 728.

His father Johnny, of course, is one of the legends of our game and a member of the Brunswick Pro Staff and tech team on-site at the Mini. He also started his bowling career at age 18, and he is now a member of the PBA Hall of Fame. Last year he entered the Sports Hall of Fame of New Jersey, joining sports greats like Yogi Berra, Carl Lewis and Vince Lombardi.

Johnny Petraglia is one of only four players to have won bowling’s triple crown, and he has won 14 tour titles and 5 senior tour titles and over \$1 million in prize money. In 1998, he became the PBA Senior Rookie of the Year.

The golden moment for Petraglia that many fans remember came in March of 1994. At age 47 he rolled a 300 on television at the PBA National Championship to earn a \$100,000 bonus. With a tear in his eye, his first words after the perfect game were “Thank God, now my kids can go to college.”

Those kids are now 18 and 12, and John Jr. is almost ready for college. He plans to enroll in the fall. When he does, he may not need all that money his dad set aside. He is an accomplished baseball player with several scholarship offers. Even pro teams have scouted the young .400+ hitter who bears an uncanny resemblance to baseball’s Mike Piazza.

Baseball is taking a back seat right now to bowling for John Jr. “I really like the technical aspects of the sport,” he says. “I enjoy trying to figure out the oil patterns and match the surfaces and equipment. I also like that bowling is an individual sport. If you screw up, you’re not letting your teammates down.”

John Jr. plans to stick with the big amateur tournaments such as the Mini Eliminator for a couple of years before he even thinks about trying the tour, and that’s okay with dad. It’s a lot different out there than when I started,” he said. No matter what happens, John Jr. will have a lot of support from one of the greatest bowlers in the history of the sport.
