DC's Finest Mixed Handicap Tourney becomes a local event

The 9th Annual DC's Finest Mixed Handicap Tournament will take place in this area for the first time July 19-20 and 26-27 at Crofton Bowling Centre. Features include teams (2 men/2 women), mixed doubles, singles (including an optional senior's handicap category for bowlers 55+), all events, and optional scratch events. Bowlers entered in singles must also bowl doubles the first time they bowl and vice versa. Enter singles multiple times but cash only once; enter doubles multiple times but cash only once with the same partner; enter teams multiple times but cash only once, cash again by changing two members.

Bowlers must use their highest certified winter average from 2012-2013 for 21+ games or highest 2013-2014 winter average for 21+ games as of May 30, 2014 or, if neither, a summer league average based on 21+ games as of July 12, 2014. The handicap basis is 90 percent of 220.

After conducting the tournament in Delaware for its first eight years, Tournament Director Eugenia McDonald offered three reasons in deciding to move to this area:

- > A lot of local bowlers asked me to bring the tournament home.
- > To cut down on extra expenses that were incurred having it out of town.
- > To be able to run the tournament a couple of weekends to give more people an opportunity to bowl.

Entries, reentries, and walk-ins will be accepted based on lane availability until 1 p.m. on July 27, 2014. An entry blank appears on page 2.

FOR THE RECORD

Bowlers competing in short-season leagues now can purchase a USBC Adult Basic membership. Available for bowlers who compete in leagues that have 16 or fewer sessions, the membership obtained through NCAUSBCA costs \$11, including state dues, and provides a USBC-certified average so bowlers can compete in local, state, and national tournaments. In addition to the league having 16 or fewer sessions, the league must designate as a "short-season" league, and the league's prize fund will be bonded. Each USBC Adult Basic membership will be good only for that league, which means if a bowler wants to participate in another short-season league, he/she would have to purchase another USBC Adult Basic membership or upgrade to a USBC Adult Standard membership. Membership cards are electronic only for the USBC Adult Basic membership. High score achievements will be recognized and officially recorded by USBC, but awards such as rings and plaques are not included in the USBC Adult Basic membership. Members do have the option to purchase high score awards. Bowlers with a current Adult Standard membership would not be required to purchase a USBC Adult Basic membership to compete in a short-season league and would be eligible for honor score awards earned in the league. The Professional Bowlers Association is now accepting applications for the 2014 Billy Welu Scholarship Award, which recognizes exemplary qualities in male or female college students who compete in the sport of bowling. The winner will receive a \$1,000 scholarship. To be eligible candidates must be amateur bowlers who are currently in college (preceding the application date) and maintaining at least a 2.5/4.0 GPA or equivalent. Applications must be postmarked by June 15. The scholarship was established to annually recognize a college student who combines outstanding bowling talents with academic excellence. Treasurers must report to league members

Another bowling season has come to an end for some or will come to an end shortly. I hope you had an enjoyable time in your leagues.

While league secretaries need to submit final averages to the office as soon as the league session has ended, treasurers are required to present a financial report to the league members at payout, which hopefully goes smoothly if your president has done his or her duty and verified the league funds are all there.

Every year, we hear of leagues that could not make the prize payout due to missing funds. Don't get caught in that mess; as a league member, you have the right to file charges against the responsible parties, starting with the president, if your funds go missing.

There is a new membership product aimed at those members who don't think they should pay \$21 for a membership card just for the summer. The basic membership is that product and is available only through leagues that bowl 16

weeks or less, and the secretary must designate on the league application that it is a "basic" league. Anyone purchasing a basic membership will not be eligible for awards and is limited to bowling in only that one league.

Numerous submissions for the "Triple Crown Award" recently have arrived at the office. This is an award given to the male and/or female bowler in a league who holds the highest league average, scratch game, and scratch series.

The 69th Open Championship Tournament has ended, and the checks have been mailed. We tried some new things this year, so if you bowled, good for you, and we hope to see you again next year. If you did not bowl, you missed a fun time and a good event, and we hope you will give it a try next year.

USBC modifies rule on bowling ball gripping holes

ARLINGTON, Texas – In a move to add greater clarity and fairness to ball specifications related to bowlers not using their thumb while delivering the ball, the United States Bowling Congress has modified the specifications on bowling ball gripping holes.

Under the new rule, any thumb hole that is not used for gripping purposes during the delivery would be classified as a balance hole. Bowling balls are only permitted one balance hole.

"A no-thumb bowler using a balance hole along with an unused thumb hole could effectively create two balance holes and change ball dynamics through layout choices in ways that are not available to a bowler who does use their thumb," USBC Interim Executive Director Chad Murphy said. "This rule change aims to create greater fairness by removing the potential advantage of two balance holes. If the bowler doesn't use the thumb hole for gripping, it's not really a gripping hole."

The rule change strictly addresses the use of the thumb hole and only affects bowlers who do not use their thumb for gripping the ball during a delivery. The change will go into effect at the beginning of the winter bowling season, August 1, allowing bowlers affected by the change the time to make necessary repairs to their equipment.

"The change is intended to simplify the specification, make it easier to enforce, and reduce confusion," USBC Managing Director of National Governing Body Neil Stremmel said. "It is not necessary to have a thumb hole if the bowler isn't going to use it for gripping purposes, and the ball has to be

Going thumb-less?

EDITOR'S NOTE: Many members of the area bowling community were shocked and saddened to learn of the sudden passing on April 30, 2014 of the author, a resident of Waldorf, Md., who was only 51 years old. Chris Ward contributed "Pro Shop Perspective" columns to this publication from 2001 to 2006. His topics always were interesting, and his writing was a joy to read ... and to edit because the "red pen" rarely was needed—he was an excellent writer.

After USBC's recent rule change regarding bowlers who don't use their thumb, it seemed appropriate to include as our tribute to Chris his last article that first appeared in the Summer 2006 issue. watch them roll the ball. We all know that "power" dominates to-day's game; otherwise, we would not concern ourselves with variables such as coefficient of friction, asymmetrical weight-blocks, and radius of gyration. Let's face it, most of us like to see the ball hook big and destroy the pins.

Thumb-less bowlers usually generate lots of ball speed. Many thumb-less bowlers must generate a faster armswing motion to keep the ball properly positioned in the palm of their hand. This usually results in increased ball speed. The extra ball speed helps delay some of the violent hooking motion on most playing conditions. Under usual house conditions, the thumb-less bowlers can

I have yet to see a thumb-less bowler make it too far beyond the age of 40 without changing his game and incorporating the use of his thumb.

There's recently been an increase in the number of bowlers not using their thumb, so I thought this would be a great time to look at this steadily increasing group of bowlers and weigh in on the debate. Here's a brief look at the pros and cons of going thumb-less as I see this growing trend.

Pros

Thumb-less bowlers usually have very high rev rates. This is great for making the pins really fly on pocket hits. This is a lot of fun for the spectators to watch and may provide a psychological edge over opponents foolish enough to

absolutely cut loose on their shots and not worry too much about repercussions. If they miss a little inside, the lane conditioner will help retard the hooking motion. If they get it a little wide, the dry boards, higher ball speed, and coefficient of friction will help the ball hook up and stop—usually right at the pocket. This can provide the thumb-less bowler a scoring advantage over the traditional bowler using two fingers and a thumb on most house conditions.

Thumb-less bowlers play more of an area or a breakpoint. Given today's soft lane conditions and devastating bowling balls, the game is really made simple if you only have to "grip it and rip it." This takes a lot of the thought processes and on lane adjustments out of the game that "traditional bowlers" are confronted with every time they step onto the approach. Because thumb-less bowlers can push the ball down the lane to their breakpoint, their adjustments are to throw it harder or maybe change bowling balls to get the pins to fall.

Cons

More time and repetition are required to improve your game. Bowlers who adopt this style of play need a lot more games and shot repetition to develop into solid players. Granted, there are some who excel at this, but for the most part, those players are too inconsistent to pose any real threat on the lanes. Those that excel at the thumb-less release either work very hard at it or are just naturally gifted. There is no other way to explain that phenomenon.

thumb-less delivery is not usually very accurate. Many traditional bowlers have problems developing accuracy. The task of becoming an accurate player is compounded exponentially without the control and direction that properly using your thumb provides. Many bowlers take for granted that outside of some league play, competitive scratch bowlers rarely get to play on soft conditions. On your heavier oil patterns or even when a soft condition gets squirrelly, accuracy pays a greater dividend. In today's "Sport Shot" leagues, tournaments, or more challenging lane conditions, the thumb-less bowlers tend to not play as well as the traditional bowl-

Tremendous arm strength is required. To successfully perform the thumb-less release, you

Q. I have a problem with my hand sweating. This causes me to drop the ball, and I lose control. What can I do to stop this problem?

now owned by Storm. It is not too expensive, and a bottle should last you for at least a couple of seasons or more.

A. You can purchase a hand dry bag at your local pro shop. You can use a micro fiber towel. Make sure whatever you use does not have rosin in it: Sweat and rosin equals glue.

I use Control Grip from Master Products. It is a white powder and comes in a plastic bottle. It has no rosin in it and keeps your hand dry while maintaining a consistent grip. Ask for it at your pro shop. If they don't have it, they can order it from Master Products, which is

Q. I have a sore wrist, and it feels like tendonitis. The pain sort of radiates from the fingers on release. I have tried wrist braces, but they are not comfortable to me. Do you have any suggestions as to what else I might try?

A. First, get yourself to a doctor and make sure you are not doing more damage to your tendons or wrist. If the doctor clears you, ask him what anti-inflammatory pills you can take to reduce pain while bowling.

You could also try having a pinkie finger hole drilled in your bowling balls. This spreads out the weight of the ball in your hand, and the pinkie finger helps the other fingers carry the weight and reduces the stress on the other fingers at release.

Q. I am a beginner bowler who loves the game. I would like to get my own equipment but am on a limited budget. What should I purchase first? Also, where should I go to get the best deal on bowling equipment?

A. The first purchase you should make is bowling shoes. They don't have to be expensive, and today's bowling shoes come in many styles. Getting the shoes first makes the most sense because every time you go bowl, you have to pay a rental fee. Take the money you would have to pay for the shoes and save it toward a bowling ball and bag.

Because you are just beginning, I would go to the pro shop where you bowl. Most of them carry shoes in stock, and you can try them on. While you are looking at the shoes, ask them about a price for a package deal. Some pro shops will give discounts if you buy the ball, bag, and shoes together. The pro shops also may have lessons available and some might throw in a lesson or two with the new equipment. Don't be afraid to ask; most pro shops are very helpful.

Q. I throw a plastic bowling ball that goes straight. My teammates are after me to buy a reactive ball so I can throw a hook. If I buy a new reactive, will the ball hook?




within our static balance requirements to be used during USBC-certified competition."

Here is how the new specification will read in the USBC Playing Rules starting August 1:

Holes or indentations for gripping purposes shall not exceed five and shall be limited to one for each finger and one for the thumb, all for the same hand. The player is not required to use all finger holes in any specific delivery, but they must be able to demonstrate, with the same hand, that each gripping hole can be simultaneously used for gripping purposes. Any thumb hole that is not used for gripping purposes during the delivery would be classified as a balance hole.

need exceptional strength in your bowling arm and wrist. You rely less on your legs and a good pendulum swing to generate ball speed, so it primarily comes from the arm and the downward momentum of the armswing generated in the approach. Keep in mind, too, that you must control the ball throughout your approach and delivery. This is no small task for a round object that weighs up to 16 pounds.

Increased potential for injury. Many bowlers that use two fingers and a thumb have suffered joint, ligament, and tendon damage due to an improperly fitted bowling ball, poor technique, or a combination of both. Now imagine significantly adding to the stress and pressure on those parts of the hand, wrist, and arm by not using your thumb. You could develop or aggravate chronic wrist problems such as carpal tunnel, tendonitis, and arthritis. Bowling also causes stress on the joints in your fingers as you lift through the ball. This pressure is increased considerably without the proper use of the thumb. One of the major points that we stress to our customers is comfort. If it does not hurt, you can bowl longer, better, and more often.

In conclusion, if you recently started bowling, I would not recommend the thumb-less release. If you are already using this technique and are comfortable with it, I would suggest a serious practice regimen to become proficient at it. Again, we want life-long customers and to see you on the lanes and bowling well past your initial AARP membership. As an intense student and fan of the game of bowling, I have seen many competitive bowlers still rolling at a very high level well into their 80s and beyond using their fingers and thumb. I have yet to see a thumb-less bowler make it too far beyond the age of 40 without changing their game and incorporating the use of their thumb.

A. The answer is *maybe*. First, it depends on your mechanics. If you put side turn on the ball at release, a reactive ball will hook. But if you don't impart any rotation on the ball, no ball will hook. You have to turn the ball at release to put spin on the ball to create hook.

My suggestion is to go to your local pro shop and ask them to watch you bowl. Tell them your objective is to throw a hook. Show them the ball you now use and ask if a new ball will help. If you in fact have a release that will create hook, a reactive will help.

Plastic balls, or more correctly, polyester, does not have much traction on today's surfaces and is mostly used for a spare ball because they go straight. If you do not create turn but still want to learn the hook ball, ask for lessons. Most pro shops today give lessons, and they can teach you how to hook the ball.


