USBC, RSCVA and Reno approve revision of tournament hosting agreement

Amendment adjusts event schedule, hosting fees, and stadium renovation timeline

ARLINGTON, Texas – The United States Bowling Congress (USBC), the Reno-Sparks Convention and Visitors Authority (RSCVA) Board of Directors, and the Reno City Council have approved revisions to the hosting agreement for USBC Championships tournaments. Key changes include shifting the USBC Open and Women's Championships back to their historical rotation of visiting Reno once every three years, adjusting the site fee, and extending the completion date for renovations at the National Bowling Stadium (NBS).

"With this agreement, the RSCVA and the City of Reno are demonstrating a deep and unquestionable commitment to bowling and our USBC membership," USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy said. "Reno's city and business leaders are true partners for USBC, and we thank everyone involved for supporting these revisions that will strengthen the future of our sport and bowling's relationship with Reno."

As part of the amendment, the RSCVA will increase the site fee to USBC from \$20 per bowler to \$30 for the duration of the agreement except the 2015 and 2018 events. The agreement also allows a more flexible timeline for the city in renovating the NBS. Stadium seating demolition now See USBC, page 11

HALL OF FAMER BILL DODDS DIES

TWO "BONUS" AWARDS NO LONGER AVAILABLE

Hall of Famer Bill Dodds, who served many years as chairman of the Awards Committee for the Nation's Capital Area Bowling Association, died January 11 at the Charlotte Hall (Md.) Veterans Home. He was 86. When Mr. Dodds arrived in this area in the early 1960s, he formed leagues at Bowl America Silver Hill, where he later served as a customer service representative before becoming assistant manager. He joined the NCABA board of directors in 1987 and shortly thereafter chaired the Awards Committee, which he handled superbly for close to 20 years. As overall scoring increased, so did the distribution of gold and silver pins and nearly all other awards. His committee work seemingly became a full-time job, with 40-hour weeks often the norm and concerns about the award-winning bowlers and their league secretaries foremost in his mind. Mr. Dodds was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1998.

The NCAUSBCA 75 and 140 Pins-Over-Average "Bonus" Awards are no longer available. A revised "Bonus" Awards application is now available for league secretaries. The "Bonus" Awards program, which this season appears in addition to NCAUSBCA's regular awards program, consists of pins and key chain awards remaining from last season that will be available as long as each supply lasts.

BRIEFLY.... Director Judith Butler recently announced the NCAUSBCA 8th Annual Youth/Adult Fellowship Sports Day will take place this summer instead of February to allow youths to participate who may be otherwise engaged during the winter months. ... Two members of the Tuesday AM Mixed at Parkland Bowl, Cheryl Randolph and Ronald Ayers, both of Upper Marlboro, Md., recently experienced the thrill of rolling their first perfect game. Randolph, reports secretary Carolyn Ivory, is in line to earn the NCAUSBCA Triple Crown Award with her 300 game, 699 series, and 193 average. ... Director Iva Sampiller has resigned from the association's board of directors.

MEMBERSHIP DEPT. Elizabeth Bennett and Bobby R. Shifflett, both of Falls Church, Va., have been indefinitely suspended from membership in USBC. Each is not to hold office and must not bowl in any USBC leagues and tournaments.

BVL contributions up 100% at 5th Annual Mixed Tourney

Total contributions to BVL from the recent NCAUSB-CA Mixed Tournament in Support of BVL exceeded \$8,000, which is a 100 percent increase over last year's total and 25 percent of the goal set by the association's BVL Committee for the 2014-2015 season.

A BVL table conducted by committee chair Berlin Myers raised \$1,954, plus \$830 from ball raffles and \$360 from 50/50s. All merchandise used in the instant raffle and the ball raffles was donated, so 100 percent of this money goes to BVL.

On the lanes, this fifth annual event, which took place December 6-7 at Bowl America Shirley, expanded from 29 teams last season to 52 teams, with some additional bowlers that bowled singles and doubles only.

BVL, bowling's oldest charity founded in 1942, supports America's veteran and active duty service men and women.

A challenging season

This has been a challenging season due to many new and different factors introduced by USBC's efforts to change the game of bowling to accommodate the new age of bowling. For example, bowlers are more inclined to apply for their membership cards online. True, it's easier to do; however, that puts more of a burden on league secretaries to ensure people are who they say they are and are eligible to bowl -not suspended under a different name. There's also a burden on the association to make sure we have received payment for the bowler. Otherwise, unpaid bowler letters get sent to secretaries.

Awards have changed big time in that 300s and 800s are now lifetime awards (including past accomplishments), and for the regular awards for which bowlers qualify, some associations don't offer any currently. Those who attend our Annual Meeting on March 15 should hear what our plans for the 2015-16 season regarding awards will be and give their input as well. Most centers in our area continue to process youth bowlers through this office, and I can tell you that has been a *very* trying situation. Unfortunately, office staffer Sharon Brown has been tasked with trying to work with Bowling Headquarters in getting our problems with the new system resolved. However, it has not been easy, as there is a third party processor involved that appears to be not familiar with what needs to be done.

Most leagues are midway now, so the usual reminders apply to have audits done and get your postponement committees ready for the weather we may get soon.

The Open Championship Tournament has changed slightly again. Entry blanks should be in your centers and are available on the association site and via our Facebook page. Let's try and make this a great tournament season.



The best bowling tip I ever received

Last year in May, Storm sent a team to our bowling center to run an event for the Wounded Warriors. A key member of the team was Peter Somoff, who just this month earned his USBC Gold Coaching credentials. He changed my grip by moving the thumb pitch forward to reduce grab of the ball during the swing. He also worked with me to increase my tempo and improve my revolutions.

Obviously, it worked somewhat because at the NCAUSBCA 33rd Annual Senior Tournament at Bowl America Woodbridge, I had my best nine games when I averaged over 226 and won the "70 and Over" scratch all events category.

is shifted from 2016 to 2020 and exterior renovations from 2018 to 2022.

According to RSCVA President and CEO Christopher Baum, "The Reno tourism community cherishes our longstanding relationship with USBC, and the fact that the City of Reno, the RSCVA, and our major resort partners were able to respond to our largest customer's concerns with a new, win-win agreement through 2026 speaks volumes about our friendship and mutual respect for each other."

The schedule change in the new agreement allows the Open and Women's Championships to visit an eastern location more regularly and opens up the 2022 Open Championships and 2024 Women's Championships for new host cities. USBC and Reno leaders expect this will boost excitement and participation in Reno years. To accommodate the new rotation, the amendment changes the length of the USBC contract with Reno to run through 2026 instead of 2030 as previously agreed.

"Members in the eastern half of the country have asked our leadership for USBC Championships to visit near them more frequently," Murphy said. "The reason we approached our partners in Reno for this change is to meet the needs of the customer and build more participation in the tournament. Traveling east will be a big part of the future as we expose new bowlers to the championships. The goal is to keep them coming back to all of our host cities including Reno."

"Bowling is incredibly important to Reno's economic well-being, and we are excited to continue welcoming USBC participants to The Biggest Little City in the future," Reno Mayor Hillary Schieve said. "This amended agreement is a big win for our community, as we look ahead to continuing our long-term partnership with the USBC."

To accommodate the schedule changes in the amendment, an adjustment also was required to previously announced Las Vegas host dates for the 2022 Women's Championships and 2023 Open Championships.

Samuel Anderson, Tabitha DeBat, and Amara Speights are the latest recipients of the prestigious NCAUSBCA Ted Gruszkowski Jr. Youth Star Award, which is named in honor of the late association Hall of Fame member who was a strong supporter of area youth bowling. The announcement of the 2015 winners took place prior to the start of opening round of the NCAUSBCA 46th Annual Youth Invitational Scratch Singles Tournament at Bowl America Manassas on January 17.

The award winners, honored for their bowling achievement and/or service to youth bowling, each were presented with a plaque and \$200 in scholarship funds, which will be administered through the USBC SMART program. In addition, their names will appear on the plaque that contains the names of the 13 previous award recipients.

SAMUEL ANDERSON Woodbridge, Virginia

Samuel, who began bowling at the age of two and first competed in a league at age 10, grew up in an avid



bowling family: His father bowled in several adult leagues, as did his sister who competed in youth and junior leagues.

Outside of his leagues at Bowl America Woodbridge and the Youth Travel Scholarship League, Samuel has competed in a wide spectrum of tournaments, ranging from NCAUSBCA

Youth 600 Club events to, for the past two years, the North Pointe Junior Gold Championships. He's been victorious at several local Youth Sweeper events, the Clyde Robert Perkins Virginia State High School competition, and the 600 Club Fall Singles held last fall at Bowl America Burke, where he dominated the field with a 753 series. In addition, Samuel has many notable finishes, placing second with Nick Nanalig last November at the NCAUSBCA 600 Club Doubles at Rinaldi's Riverdale and a final round appearance in the 2014 NCAUSBCA Youth Invitational Scratch Singles. Last summer, Samuel had the second highest performance among Virginia bowlers at the North Pointe Junior Gold Championships in Buffalo, N.Y.

Samuel has rolled four perfect games, including the only one tossed in the 2014 Invitational, and he has a high series of 822.

Though he has a significant list of accolades, his attitude towards others and the sport really distinguishes the type of bowler and person he is. Samuel supports others no matter the circumstance and always strives to do his best until the very end. He also performs well in school, maintaining a very respectable GPA above a 3.0.

Samuel Anderson's tenacious attitude embodies the true essence of a champion, and this, along with his on-lane successes, strongly support the reasons why he is so deserving of the NCAUSBCA Ted Gruszkowski Jr. Youth Star Award.

TABITHA DEBAT Manassas, Virginia

Tabitha was born in Mississippi, but she moved to this area with her family after Hurricane Katrina devas-



tated a large portion of the south in 2005. She started bowling in 2008 at Bowl America Chantilly and for the past four years has competed at Bowl America Manassas.

When she moved to Bowl America Manassas she was in the junior/senior league where she rolled her first 600. She has

bowled in the travel league for nearly three years. During this time, she became a Junior Gold member.

During her time at Bowl America Chantilly, she placed several times in the NCAUSBCA Youth Championship and Vern Burke tournaments and won scholarship money.

Tabitha bowls in any tournament that she can. She

bowls in the city tournament, 600 Club tournaments, Vern Burke tournaments, Junior Gold tournaments, Invitational tournament and any local center tournaments that the centers may have. She has also bowled in the Virginia State tournament.

Last year, she was the only female to reach the final round of the NCAUSBCA Youth Invitational Scratch Singles Tournament, ultimately placing fourth in the B Division. She later participated in the National Junior Gold Tournament in Buffalo, New York.

Tabitha currently does a lot of community service within the sport of bowling, working with younger bowlers whenever needed. Tabitha helps with the "Have-a-Ball" program at Bowl America Manassas, and she helps at school fairs with the bowling booth. She also volunteers with the Special Olympics Area 23 bowling program. When she works with these groups, she stresses that bowling is a fun game and those present should not get upset with themselves if bowling poorly.

A few coaches this year started a program at Bowl America Manassas entitled "Steppin' Up to Chicago" to help youth bowlers with their mental and physical aspects to the game. Tabitha joined the group of 35 that meets monthly.

Whether helping others or seeking ways to improve her own game, Tabitha DeBat has demonstrated a dedication to bowling that merits her the NCAUSBCA Ted Gruszkowski Jr. Youth Star Award.

AMARA SPEIGHTS Woodbridge, Virginia

Amara, a 14-year-old eighth-grader at Rippon Middle School in Woodbridge, Va., started bowling when she



was five in Stafford, Va., where she joined the Stafford Youth Bowling League.

Amara joined the youth League at Bowl America Woodbridge in 2008, and each season her average has increased. At the end of 2008-2009, her average was 110; in the seasons that followed, her average increased to 142, 164,

174, 201, and 204. It currently is 206.

When Amara was only 10 years old, she moved up to the senior division.

Amara has received the NCAUSBCA Triple Crown Award the past two seasons in the Saturday Youth League at Bowl America Woodbridge. She also bowls in the Youth Travel League, which uses the tougher Sport lane patterns. In 2013-2014, her final average in that league was 180, with a high game of 246 and a top series of 643.

Amara won the 2013 Virginia State Pepsi Tournament in the U12 Girls Division by 330 pins and had the highest six-game total, 1,292, among all of the girl divisions. The following year, she again placed first in the Pepsi event, this time in the U15 Girls Division.

She qualified for the North Pointe Junior Gold Tournament in 2013 and 2014 in the U15 Girls Division. In Detroit in 2013, she placed 72nd out of 169 bowlers. Last year, in Buffalo, N.Y., the right-hander had a great run: She qualified for the finals and made it to match play, averaging 178 and tying for seventh place in a field of 208.

New equipment; inserts; fixing overturning; no ovens; calming nerves

Q. I want to buy a new ball with the Christmas gift cards I received. I know you are a Roto Grip staffer. Does Roto Grip have anything new coming out?

A. We at Roto Grip are excited about the new additions that hit the market this month. The Roto Grip Hyper Cell Skid is a great addition to the line for all of us who love the Hyper Cell but need a powerful ball that will go down the lane further and save energy for the backs. The Hyper Cell Skid is the pearl version of the original Hype Cell; it comes with a 1,500grit polished surface and will get through the heads clean.

If you are after a ball that will go even longer, you will want the Roto Grip Unhinged. This ball also is a pearl with 1,500-grit polish but has a late roll core. It will get down the lane even further than The Skid. This ball will be great for dryer lanes and slower-speed players. Roto Grip also has a new spare ball called the Own It that is cherry red.

Q. I see the better bowlers in my area using finger inserts and

thumb inserts. I don't use any inserts. What is the reason for using inserts?

A. Using inserts is a matter of choice. Some believe finger inserts help to create more revs on the ball that can help to knock down more pins. It is true that finger inserts, due to more friction, can get you a little more turn on the ball, but this comes with a price. Finger inserts put more strain on the tendons in the fingers and hand, and this is why I don't recommend finger inserts for youth bowlers.

I personally don't use finger inserts. I tried them once and suffered a tendon strain that took a year to heal. I do know that most people can use them without any problem, so if you want to experiment with them on a ball or two, you might like them.

Thumb inserts are different than finger inserts. They are hard and smooth and help to get a more consistent feel of the ball. Reactive urethane has a tendency to be sticky, and you don't want sticky when it comes to the thumb hole.

There also are thumb inserts you can get that can be moved from ball to ball. These are my favorites. Most of these inserts have several pieces to them. There is an insert that goes into the ball. Then there is a slug that is drilled to fit your thumb, and this screws into the piece in the ball. The great thing about this type of thumb insert is after you work out and modify the thumb piece to perfectly fit, you just unscrew it and move it to any other ball in your arsenal. You have the same feel with every ball and don't have to fight the subtle changes in the fit of different thumb holes. They do cost more because you need the same base in each ball you own, but you only need two thumb slugs-one that's your regular size and one a halfsize bigger to allow for swelling during longer tournaments or hotter weather.

Q. Lately I have been getting a lot of "over-under" no matter where I bowl. I asked a one of the better bowlers in my league to watch me, and he said I am turning the ball early. I have tried to stop, but I keep doing it. Is there a trick you might know of that could help me?

A. I got a great trick for the solution of overturning the ball from the late, great coach, John Jowdy. I was going through the same thing, and he said, "Aim with your ring finger. When going to the line, aim at the spot you want to hit with your ring finger." This simple trick will instantly keep your hand behind the ball longer.

Q. My ball quit reacting in the back-end, and I did not want to buy a new ball at this time. So I put the ball in the oven to extract the oil out. I set the oven at 350. You have most likely guessed the ball melted. What is the proper temperature to set the oven at to extract the oil?

A. Sorry! I am not going to give you an answer for this question. As you found out, putting the ball in the oven at any temperature is a bad idea. Most of the time, the best result you will get from putting a ball in the oven will be the opportunity to purchase a new ball. Most pro shops are equipped to rejuvenate the ball. This, combined with resurfacing the ball, will get a few months more life out of the ball. If you secretly wanted a new ball anyway, just go buy one. Forget the oven.

Q. I have been bowling for several years now. I average in the low 200s, and my goal is to get a 300 game. But so far every time I get on a string, my nerves kick in, and I throw a bad shot. Do you have a suggestion on how to calm the nerves?

A. This will sound like a cliche, but take each shot one at a time. Do not make the major mistake of thinking ahead of the shot you're making now. You can't throw the 12th strike before you throw the ninth strike. Remember, a 300 game is not 12 strikes in a row. It is one strike in a row 12 times. Stay in the present, not in the future. Good Luck!


