George R. Lucas Jr., and Jaime N. Lucas of St. Leonard, Md., have been suspended from membership in USBC and are not to hold office or bowl in any USBC leagues and tournaments. ... Kevin L. Lomax of Bowie, Md., Nigel Robinson of Upper Marlboro, Md., and John W. Smallwood Sr. of Severn, Md., have been reinstated to membership in USBC and again become eligible to compete in USBC leagues and tournaments with all of the attendant membership privileges. ... The list of suspended area bowlers is available here.

Corrected 2013-2014 league averages: For Franklin Phillips IV (200 for 90 games) in the Tuesday Night Mixed at The Lanes Fort Meade. ... For Andrew J. Shevitz (203/93) and Doris A. Shevitz (145/69) in the Sunday Nite Foursome at Bowl America Manassas.

On April 2 in the Mixed Signals.org League at Bowl America Chantilly, John Morgan recorded 33 of 36 strikes in scoring an 895 series on games of 299-297-299. The series, a record for the center and for all of Virginia, was three pins short of the NCAUSBCA mark of 898 (34 strikes) by Zo Isaac on August 5, 2010 at AMF Capital Plaza. ... Meanwhile, on April 28, Michael Andrejack rolled 35 strikes but fell short of Morgan's and Isaac's tallies when the left-hander tossed 300-290-300/890 in the Merchants Mixed League at Bowl America Woodbridge. Andrejack's series was a center record, which had a previous high of 858 by Allen Windsor recorded just 10 days earlier in the NCAUSBCA 70th Annual Open Championship Tournament.

Hall of Fame members Doris Shepherd and Marilyn Hatch recently died. Both women were elected to the Hall for their meritorious service to bowlers. Shepherd, who died April 1, was a youth coach, bowling organizer, and officer for numerous leagues and served both the Vir-Mar District AJBC (American Junior Bowling Conress) and the Washington, D.C. Area Women's Bowling Association (WDCAWBA). She was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1988 and was present at the association induction ceremonies this past October. ... Hatch, a member of the Hall of Fame's "Class of 1996," died May 12. She also served the area bowling community in many different roles but perhaps was best known as tournament director of the Virginia Bowling Queens, an organization she help founded. Hatch, who served on the WDCAWBA board of directors for eight years, was a nominating committee member of the Virginia State Women's Bowling Association.

Secretaries should check for Triple Crown Award candidates

The 2014-2015 fall league season is almost over. I hope you had an enjoyable time in your leagues.

League secretaries are reminded that final averages are to be submitted to the NCAUSBCA office soon after the final league session has ended and no later than June 1.

Please remember to submit the application and final standings sheet for any Triple Crown Award winners in your league. This award is given to the male and/or female bowler in a league that holds the highest average, highest scratch game, and highest scratch series. A fillable form can be found on the association site in the "Secretary's Corner" section.

Treasurers are required to present a financial report to the league members at payout.

Anyone purchasing a USBC Adult Basic membership will not be eligible for awards and is limited to bowling in only one league. Additional information about this membership is available here.

June 15 is the postmark application deadline for the PBA Billy Welu Scholarship Award, which recognizes a college student who combines outstanding bowling talents with academic excellence. The winner will receive a \$1,000 scholarship. To be eligible, candidates must be amateur bowlers who are currently in college (preceding the application date) and maintaining at least a 2.5/4.0 GPA or equivalent.

Checks have been mailed for the NCAUSBCA 70th Annual Open Championship Tournament. Special events included the 50-59 Singles, 60+ Singles, and the 50+ All Events; the tournament added \$250 to the prize fund for each of these optional events.

The USBC Convention recently took place in Omaha, Neb., and information regarding this event appears on page 21.

By now, you realize that the USBC Honor Score lifetime limitation is for real. We received a lot of calls this season from bowlers who were affected by the policy that became effective August 1, 2014.

The NCAUSBCA board of directors and the Youth Committee are currently working on the following:

> NCAUSBCA delegates approved the new local association local awards program, and the board is finalizing the program to be offered after a few gaps were discovered.

> The Youth Committee is looking into the processing of youth memberships for the 2015-2016 season-who will do the processing and what fees will be charged.

NCAUSBCA 70th Annual Open Championship Tournament official prize list

March 28-29 • April 11-12, 18-19, 2015

In the NCAUSBCA 70th Annual Open Championship Tournament, "Team Waldon #1" of Alexandria, Va., which consisted of Phillip Langhorne (527), Aaron Sansbury (582), Anthony Hayes (652), Jerry Davis (659), and Sean Waldon (626) scored 3,685 to take the Team title. Meanwhile, "FSBCB" of Manassas, Va., recorded 3,590 to take the Scratch Team crown. Members included Oscar Friendly (767), Christopher Schlosser (731), Athan Burch (719), Jeremy Crookston (737), and Shawn Bevenour (636).

Nathaniel Atkins, Huntingtown, Md., and Nathan Bolden, Lanham, Md., each won two titles. Atkins (764) teamed with Darryle Hopkins, Beltsville, Md. (660) to total 1,615 for the Doubles crown; Atkins also captured the 50+ All Events title with a score of 2,290.

Bolden (277-257-258/792) scored 886 to capture the Singles title. He also placed first in All Events with his 2,522 (792-786-662) tally.

Dave Leatherman, Oak Hill, Va. (780) and Richard H. Holmes, Culpepper, Va. (719) totaled 1,499 to take the Scratch Doubles title.

Wilbert "Allen" Windsor of Woodbridge, Va., rolled an 858 series (279-300-279) to bring home the Scratch Singles title.

Ira Darden Jr., Upper Marlboro, Md., averaged 254 for nine games, rolling series of 745-745-796 to total 2,286, which earned him the Scratch All Events title.

The optional seniors events continue to be popular. In addition to the 50+ All Events victory by Atkins, Rick A. Martin, Lorton, Va., won the 50-59 Singles title with a score of 830, and Steven Trimble, Springfield, Va., earned the 60+ Singles title with his 833.





Staying in bowling shape during the summer

Q. Now that the bowling season is winding down, my question to you: What can I do during the summer to keep in bowling shape for next season?

A. Summer is the best time to work on the parts of your game that need help. Go to your local pro shop or center and ask about some coaching. Getting a coach is not as expensive as you might think. The coach can help with things like lane play and spare shooting, not just the physical game.

Practice is generally cheaper in

the summer months. Ask your center about a game punch card. Many centers offer 20-, 50-, or even 100game punch cards at a reduced rate. Summer is also time to have the pro shop evaluate your equipment, get the bowling balls cleaned and resurfaced if needed, and fill in your arsenal with a new ball or two if needed. Just like the center, it is off-season for the pro shop, and deals can be made.

Also. don't forget summer leagues; you can join one just to keep in competition shape. I usually bowl in one Reno league just to keep my game in shape. If your center has one, try it. They are fun with little pressure, but you still have something to bowl for.

Q. I have been trying to throw the ball harder. When I try this, all I do is pull the ball most of the time. What is going on? Can you help me fix this problem?

A. Trying to throw the ball with more speed by just throwing it harder is not the answer. When you throw the ball harder, you have to introduce muscling to the equation. The result is pulling the ball much of the time.

To get more speed, it has to be done with the legs and the armswing. You can back up on your approach about six inches if you have room and take slightly larger steps. You can position the ball higher, closer to your shoulders or chin to lengthen your swing. You can also go to a coach that uses video and have your approach checked.

If you watch most of the professionals, you will see that they start the approach with a couple of slow steps and then explode into a faster last three steps that create leverage and speed. Chris Barnes is a great example of this. You will see his legs and swing creating ball speed.

Getting a coach to help with this is the best way to work this into your game.

Q. I have been bowling in a men's league for a few years now, and my teammates want me to go to the state tournament with them. I am apprehensive about this because I have never bowled in a tournament, and I don't think I am good enough. They said it makes no difference to them. What do you think?

A. City and state tournaments are a great way to be introduced to tournament bowling. Most of them are either handicapped to help keep you even with other better bowlers, or they are set in divisions. Divisions put you in a block of bowlers with the same skill set you have. State tournaments are a fun weekend out of town, and you're bowling in a different environment than what you are used to. It will give you a taste of what it's like to go to a USBC Open Championships Tournament, with a lower cost. If you like it, you might try a USBC Open sometime. This event is normally held in a different city in the nation each year.

Bowlers of all average levels love this tournament and use it as a vacation and a reason to visit different parts of the country. This year's USBC Open is in El Paso, Texas.

Q. I am going to the 2015 USBC Open Championships, and I know

the shot is close to flat oil on a new synthetic surface. It is going to play tough, with not much room for mistakes. Is there anything with pin placement or ball surface I can do to gain some advantage?

A. I had an idea for this question but wanted to check my answers with a renowned coach that I thought would be an even better resource of information. I thus contacted Ron Hoppe, who has coached several PBA stars, and I trust his opinions. His advice was to put the pin over the fingers, then take at least three balls with different surfaces, say 4000, 1500, and 750. Give each one a try and see how they react. One of those should help on that condition, but you still have to make good shots.

Q. I have a problem getting the ball to hook at the center I bowl in. They seem to have a long oil pattern, and I throw the ball fast,

around 19 to 20 mph. What can I do besides slow down my speed to create hook?

A. Here is what you need to know about your hook potential: There is more than the oil pattern and ball speed that can keep a ball from hooking. Heavy oil and long oil act like speed; a polished ball, a high rg ball and weak coverstock, all of these things also act like speed.

You want to achieve a balance to get the reaction you want. You will want a lower rg ball, probably with a drilling pattern that will help get the ball into an earlier roll.

You might experiment with a sanded ball or a matte finish to help with the mid-lane read. You might just need a couple of these things or all of them to get the desired reaction.

Your objective is to slow the ball down by increasing the friction of the ball on the lane. Go to your pro shop and ask for help with these ball changes.

BOWLING 101 • HARLIN MATKINS



First things first: Get a ball that fits your hand

EDITOR'S NOTE: Harlin Matkins, whose "Bowling 101" column appeared in nearly every issue of this publication from 2000 to 2009, died February 24, 2015 at age 87 after a lengthy period of declining health. A retired Naval architect, a certified instructor and graduate of Dick Ritger's Bowling Academy for Instructors, and a certified youth and bowling development instructor for Bowl America, Matkins loved bowling, bowlers, and especially those who were new to our game. He enjoyed the "Bowling 101" title, in part because he wrote so often on the fundamentals of the game he wanted every bowler to possess. As a tribute to Mr. Matkins, the column below is offered, which first appeared in the September 2006 issue.

A properly fitted bowling ball is essential for all bowling skills. New bowlers soon need to purchase their own bowling ball (or plug and re-drill old or used bowling equipment) to custom fit the ball to their bowling hand. This should be done by a local pro shop operator, who is trained to assist you:

> Determine and select the best ball for you and your style of bowlwell as a customized-fitted ball. Also, your bowling style and the lane conditions at the bowling center where you bowl should be taken into consideration to achieve optimum performance from your ball.

Visit and make friends with the pro shop operator before and after purchasing your ball. Buying your own ball or checking out your current ball with the pro shop operator may also help you to discover ways to become a better bowler. Individual bowlers have unique hands and different-sized fingers and thumbs. The pro shop operator's evaluation may identify problems and prevent future hand and

Let the pro shop operator guide and assist you in determining the best ball weight for you. Heavier is not always better.

> Choose the ball weight that will accommodate your body and strength.

> Select the ball drill layout best suited for your bowling game or individual needs.

House balls are drilled for both left- and right-handed bowlers and will not fit your particular hand as finger injuries that may develop from ill-fitted balls with incorrect finger and thumb sizes or incorrect spans between the thumb and finger holes in the balls you presently use.

Information helpful to the pro shop operator is contained in the accompanying sidebar provided by Steve Harter, a professional ball driller for Bowl America. It contains a list of desired information that would assist in determining the best possible ball selection and drilling layout for you and your game. Keep in mind, however, that the pro shop operator normally is busy and does not have unlimited time.

When bowling, it is important to use a bowling ball of the right weight suited to your hand, body size, and strength. Bowling balls come in different colors and weights. The finger and thumb grip hole sizes are drilled in the ball to suit all kinds of hands and bowlers. The maximum weight of any ball is 16 pounds, and its circumference

Information helpful to the pro shop operator

- > Have an idea of how much money you intend to spend.
- > Know the weight of the ball you want. If you have an old ball, bring it.
- > What type of ball do you want—one with more hook or less hook? Most beginners start with a non-finger-tip grip but should consider a finger-tip.
- > Give as much information to the ball driller as possible—the more information avail-able, the better fit will be achieved. Identify your oil line or ball track on the ball, if possible.
- > Snug is better: Finger and thumbs are *not* round; most pro shops drill round holes and then shave the holes to match the hand.
- > After the ball is drilled, you should bowl some and then take the ball back to the driller for any adjustments. Don't bowl just a couple of balls; make sure by bowling two or three games.
- > Stay away from department store balls—see the pro shop operator.

is 27 inches with a diameter of approximately 8½ inches.

Let the pro shop operator guide and assist you in determining the best ball weight for you. Heavier is not always better. For a proper grip, the finger holes should be snug and the thumb hole slightly larger to allow a clean release.

In a relaxed grip, the fingers are inserted near to the second knuckle and the palm of the index finger of the hand lies against the ball. Our ball driller suggests you begin with a finger-tip grip to the first knuckle. For older seniors and children, the conventional grip to the second knuckle may be a better choice.

When checking the drilling of your new or re-drilled ball, make sure you insert your thumb all the way into the ball for better control and less stress on the fingers. If the thumb is not all the way into the thumb hole, the span will be incorrect for a proper fit and ball release.

Since the middle finger and the ring finger are dominant in the lifting, rotating, and releasing of the ball, the holes should be comfortably loose. The span between the thumb and fingers should be snug and yet stretched enough to hold the ball securely. In practice swings, you should be able to swing the ball easily without squeezing it or having undue stress on your shoulder.

How to determine the correct ball weight

For children, a good rule is to use a ball that weighs the same in pounds as the age of the child or 10 percent of the child's body weight. For example, if the child weights 80 pounds, an eight-pound ball is about right for his or her size. De-

Mandatory merger proposal rejected at **USBC Annual Meeting**

OMAHA, Nebraska - In addition to electing three board members, delegates on April 30 rejected legislative proposals requiring the merger of non-merged state and local associations during the final day of the 2015 United States Bowling Congress Convention and Annual Meeting in Omaha, Nebraska.

The 761 voting delegates (723 association delegates, 14 athletes, and 24 board members) voted on eight proposals involving changes to USBC bylaws, league rules, and tournament rules during the legislative session. USBC bylaws proposals required a two-thirds vote to pass, while league rules and tournament rules required a majority vote.

Delegates rejected two amendments to USBC National Bylaws requiring non-merged local and non-merged state associations to be merged. They also rejected a proposal to change the national dues maximum from \$10 to \$8, two amendments to League Rules and one amendment to Tournament Rules.

Two legislative proposals were accepted—allowing Youth state delegates to vote on adult dues and the adult directors on the board, and allowing Youth local representatives to vote on adult dues, adult directors on the board and adult delegates/alternates for the state meeting. The USBC Board previously approved two legislative proposals allowing everyone on the local and state level to vote on youth-related items. The actions by the delegates and Board allow everyone to vote on all issues.

Elections to the USBC national board also took place Thursday. Current board members Karen



pending on the child's strength, the ball weight may be changed to suit.

The proper weight of the bowling ball for youth and adults is determined by the arm and hand strength of the bowler. Hold the selected ball in the bowling hand, the weight supported by the nonbowling hand, and extend the ball and hand in front of the body with the elbow free and not propped against the body.

Remove the non-bowling hand and let the weight of the ball rest in the outstretched bowling hand and arm. If the ball pulls the hand and arm abruptly downward with little hand- and arm-holding resistance, the ball is too heavy and will probably be uncontrollable.

On the other hand, if there is little feel of a gravity pull on the ball, or if the ball does not pull the arm downward, the ball is too light.

Experiment until you find the right weight and ball for you-a ball that will allow you to push the ball out from the body and into a controlled smooth out-and-downward pendulum arc or free swing. Controlling the ball swing and release is more important than using a heavier ball that is difficult to handle and release consistently over the target.

For most bowlers, accuracy is the name of the game, and a properly fitted ball is a must to achieve consistency and higher scores.
