# **GOODE-BLACKMORE DUO WINS MIXED SCRATCH DOUBLES**

The team of Kathy Goode, Lorton, Va. (628 series) and Popeye Blackmore, Springfield, Va. corded a total of 1,401 to win the \$800 top prize in the NCAUSBCA Mixed Scratch Doubles Tournament held February 21 at Bowl America Fairfax. Goode is victorious for the second consecutive year, having won the 2015 event with Allen Windsor. Meanwhile, Blackmore pocketed an extra \$60 in the Men's Singles with his series, and Latoya Kirkland, Dumfries, Va., earned the same in the Women's Singles with her 666 series. # **PBA BILLY WELU SCHOLARSHIP DEADLINE: JUNE 15**

The Professional Bowlers Association Billy Welu Scholarship is awarded annually, recognizing exemplary qualities in male or female college students who compete in the sport of bowling. scholarship winner receives \$1,000. To be eligible, candidates must be amateur bowlers who are currently in college (preceding the application date) and maintain at least a 2.5/4.0 GPA or equivalent. Applications must be postmarked by June 15. scholarship was established to annually recognize a college student who combines outstanding bowling talents with academic excellence. The late Welu was best known for his expert analysis alongside legendary ABC broadcaster and PBA Hall of Famer Chris Schenkel on the popular "Pro Bowlers Tour" series. Welu was a two-champion PBA Tour champion and was a member of the PBA Hall of Fame's inaugural induction class in 1975. # Time for action

Everyone should get their teams and doubles partners together since entries now will close on March 28. This year's tournament will offer bowlers more opportunities to win prizes in a variety of categories, so do not delay. Squad times are filling quickly, and you do not want to be left out. As a reminder, you are in the home stretch in terms of your winter league play. The president and the selected league audit group should have reviewed the treasurer's records at least twice by this time of the season to ensure monies are at the levels they should be. You do not want to be surprised when payout time comes. For most of us, it will be here in a few months, and you don't want to learn at that time of a problem with the league's money.

The awards program is in full swing, and all league secretaries should send their award applications to the NCAUSBCA office as soon as possible. We would like to see individuals be recognized in their centers during their league season and not after it has ended.

# New average integrity rules announced for 2017 USBC Open Championships

ARLINGTON, Texas - The 2017 United States Bowling Congress Open Championships will feature new average requirement rules that will use additional data to strengthen the integrity of the tournament's divisions. A central feature of the new rules will be the use of participants' Open Championships tournament average to help place bowlers in the correct divisions.

The new rules will require teams to set rosters 14 days in advance of participation, so tournament staff can have time to evaluate and verify averages. The 2017 tournament will mark the debut of a third division, the Standard Division for bowlers with entering averages of 181-209. The Regular Division now will be for bowlers with averages of 210 and above, while the Classified Division remains for bowlers who have averages of 180 and below.

# Important decisions made at Annual Membership Meeting

Spring is in the air, and the 2015-2016 bowling season is almost over. Your league hopefully didn't miss too many weeks due to snow.

Our association conducted its 10th Annual Membership Meeting on February 28, and the results of the voting appear on pages 8 and 9. Virginia State USBC delegates and national USBC delegates are elected at this annual gathering. (The 2016 Virginia State USBC Annual Meeting will be held in Hampton on April 16, and the USBC Convention will take place April 26-29 in Reno, Nev.)

These delegates represent you and vote as you have directed at our Annual Membership Meeting, so it is important that you attend this meeting to give direction to the delegates. Decisions made at these meetings may affect your bowling for years to come, i.e., the decision to do away with nearly all USBC awards.

Tournament season is in full swing now, with our Mixed Scratch **Doubles and Youth Championship** tournaments recently completed. The Open Championship (April 2-3, 9-10, and 16-17 at The Lanes Fort Meade and AMF Capital Plaza) and the Women's Championship (June 18-19 and 25-26 at Potomac Lanes) events are still to come.

Hall of Fame nominations are

due April 30, so if you have any candidates you deem worthy of recognition, please submit their names with supporting documentation. All are welcome to nominate.

Secretaries are reminded to certify "second-half" leagues. If you are bowling in a short-season league in which there may be bowlers with USBC Basic memberships, please be aware of the limitations of this membership that include certification only for that one league in addition to no awards offered.

Secretaries who provide us with their eMail address periodically are sent updates of association events. They thus can choose to receive an online version of their final averages form (that also includes receiving an electronic confirmation of receipt), in addition to obtaining links to the latest online version of this publication, tournament entry forms and current standings, and much more. Of course, we ask all Facebook users to "Like Us" at facebook.com/ncausbca to receive the latest association news.

# Willie Graves Jr. elected president

# Attendees choose Mayes, Garrett for vice president positions

Members attending the 10th Annual Membership Meeting of the Nation's Capital Area USBC Association held February 28 at the National Golf Club at Tantallon in Fort Washington, Md., elected Willie Graves Jr., Mitchellville, Md., president for a two-year term beginning August 1, 2016. Graves became acting president last October following the death of Larry Gonzales.

Meanwhile, Darron Mayes, Waldorf, Md., who was appointed second vice president with board approval following the resignation of Hazel Wallace in January, was elected second vice president, while Diane Garrett, District Heights, Md., was elected fourth vice president.

Directors elected for a two-year term by majority vote included Jonathan Emery, Fort Washington; and Michael Riley Jr., Alexandria; Va., along with incumbents Cynthia Black, Cheltenham, Md.;

Sondra Blakey, Forestville, Md.; James Butler, Mitchellville; Andrew "Doc" Campbell, Fort Washington; Dwight Franklin, Largo, Md.; Jim Lewis, Waldorf; Adam Mitchell, Ashburn, Va.; Clayton Stone, Alexandria; and Helen Toms, Adelphi, Md.

Virginia State delegates elected for the 2016-2017 season included Robert Ashley III, Centreville, Va.; Cynthia Black; Connie Brown, Alexandria; James Butler; Andrea Dale, Stafford, Va.; and Diane Garrett.

The vote by attendees on each of the USBC 2016 proposed amendments mirrored that done during the January meeting of the NCAUSBCA board, with each proposal rejected except for Bylaws Proposal B 4 (see page 9).

Delegates elected to the 2017 **USBC** Convention included Robert Ashley III; Connie Brown; James Butler; Andrea Dale; Tom Dale Jr., Stafford; Diane Garrett; Willie

Graves Jr.; Adam Mitchell; Natalie Morales, Alexandria; and Clayton Stone, Alexandria.

A proposal passed by attendees that took effect immediately set the Annual Membership Meeting quorum at 50, with a minimum of 40 adult and 10 youth representatives.

During the Annual Membership Meeting, Mark Bennett, Gaithersburg, Md., and Cheryl Durham, Clinton, Md., each took home \$55 after winning "50/50" drawings, Yvonne Humphries, D.C., won a \$100 gift certificate, and the \$100 offer by Dominic Parham, Landover Hills, Md., won the "Silent Auction" box of goodies.

At the Youth Representative Meeting that preceded the Annual Meeting, Andre Andrews, D.C., was elected to the NCAUSBCA board by attendees, as were incumbent directors Ruth Adams, Montgomery Village, Md.; Tom Dale Jr.; and Dominic Parham.

During the morning Board of Directors Meeting, Tom Dale Jr. was appointed with board approval to complete the term of Fourth Vice President Susan Ryan, who recently resigned.





# **17th Annual Guys & Dolls Tournament Rules**

- 1. The Tournament is open to any bowler providing proof of a 2015-2016 USBC Membership and current book average, or a final 2015-2016 league standings sheet.
- 2. Bowlers must present a USBC membership card. in the tournament office **45 minutes prior** to scheduled start time. Lineup will be <u>as shown on entry form.</u> Teams or bowlers failing to appear on the lanes, prepared to bowl at the scheduled time, shall forfeit their entry unless sufficient reason is given to warrant postponement.
- 3. Bowlers entered in the singles event must also enter the doubles event and visa-versa.
- 4. The Team captain, or his legal representative, has the privilege of substituting other bowlers for those originally entered. Only same sex substitutions will be accepted. In the doubles event, the names of both entrants must be given. Entries with the word "PARTNER" will not be accepted. Each Team MUST consist of 2 Men and 2 Women, and Doubles MUST consist of 1 Male and 1 Female.
- 5. The Doubles event will be bowled immediately following the Singles event. SINGLES is Bowled First.
- 6. All entrants will bowl 3 games on one pair of lanes in each event, unless mechanical failures dictate otherwise. No entry money will be refunded if it is discovered that a team or individual has failed to comply with all rules of the United States Bowling Congress and all rules and requirements of this tournament.
- 7.Handicap will be 90% of the difference between the bowler's entering average and a scratch figure of 230 All handicaps will be calculated on a 3 game basis. It shall be the responsibility of each bowler to verify his or her average. Failure to use proper average shall disqualify scores bowled if submitted average is lower than actual average. Prize winnings will be based on submitted average if it is higher than the actual average. Average corrections must be made prior to the completion of the FIRST GAME.
- 8. <u>USBC RULE 319a(2) WILL APPLY. 10 PIN RULE</u> If your average this season is 10 or more pins higher than last season, this year's average will be used. (Next Year we will use highest average over 2 years)
- 9. If a bowler does not have a 2014-2015 yearbook average, the bowler may use the highest current certified average (of 21 or more games) as of the closing date for entries of the tournament (May 27, 2016), otherwise they must enter with an average of 230. If using current average, a league sheet showing average as of May 27, 2016 must be provided to Tournament Officials at check-in or emailed with entry form. If bowler does not have a yearbook or current average and competed in a summer league, that average, of at least 21 games, may be used provided it is verified at the tournament office. USBC Rules 319 c, d, & e will apply.
- 10. The prize ratio for each event will be one prize for each five entries. Lineage and Expense = \$12.50, Prize Money = \$12.50 per bowler per handicap event. PRIZE MONEY WILL BE RETURNED 100%.
- 11. In the event of a tie for first place (team, doubles, singles) the tied contestants will bowl 3 games in accordance with the rules of the tournament at such time and place as decided by the Tournament Manager. Total pins, including handicap, for the 3 games will determine the winner. In the event of a tie for first place in the All Events, USBC Rule 326a will apply. When there is a tie for any championship in a tournament, it is optional with tournament management to have a playoff or declare co-champions.
- 12. Entrants must report any previous tournament prize winnings in the last year of \$ 600.00 or more in total. If entrant has won \$600.00 or more in total prize winnings for a tournament, he/she must submit all his/her tournament scores and winnings PRIOR TO BOWLING. USBC Rule 319e
- 13. PARTICIPATION & DRESS CODE RULES
  - a. All Bowlers must wear shirts with collars or MOCK Collars, NO EXCEPTIONS!!.
  - b. NO T-SHIRTS or SHORT Shorts may be worn on the lanes.
  - c. Bowlers may enter doubles 2 times as long as partners change. Bowlers may only cash once in scratch singles, (Highest Score). Bowlers may enter the team event 3 times, as long as 2 members of the team change.
  - **d.** Only one professional (PBA or PWBA) member allowed per doubles pair, and only 2 per team.
  - e. NO CLOTHES WITH HOLES may be worn on the lanes.
- 14. Scores lost due to malfunction of automatic scorers shall be re-bowled.
- 15. Scores for ALL-EVENTS will be taken from the FIRST series bowled in each event. (Team, Doubles, & Singles)
- 16. USBC Rule 330 will apply. (A bowler must use the same hand to deliver the bowling ball throughout the tournament).
- 17. USBC Rule 329, a protest or appeal involving eligibility or playing rules must be filed with Tournament Management, the Local Association or USBC up to <u>5 Days before tournament prizes are paid</u>. The protest or appeal must be in writing and the grounds for the protest or appeal briefly stated.
- 18. A \$ 20.00 ADMINISTRATIVE FEE, PLUS BANK CHARGES WILL BE LEVIED ON ANY RETURNED CHECKS.
- 19. SCRATCH EVENTS: Bowlers must compete in regular tournament to enter scratch event. Scores from handicap event will be used to determine winners of the scratch event.

# Invitational Notebook

Snow pushed back the start of the tournament one week, which moved the first round to Bowl America Gaithersburg, followed by Bowl America Fairfax, Bowl America Bull Run, AMF Capital Plaza, and finishing at Bowl America Shirley. The original schedule included a Round 4 stop at Bethesda Naval Bowling Center.

A Division champion Conner Kolessides has to be considered among the greatest Invitational players of all time, not only for winning three times in the past four years, but get this: He competed in the final round in each of the past six years, placing eighth in 2011, seventh in 2012, and sixth last year. ... Besides Kolessides, only four other finalists bowled in Round 5 last year-Jarrett DeFalco, Randall Stewart, Aidan Kaz, and Leonard Farlow Jr.


Amara Speights is the first female to make the A Division finals since Keisheena Waldon placed eighth in the 2007 event. Speights, who is only 15, has improved tremendously in the past two years, and it's a safe bet this won't be her last finals appearance. ... Seven girls reached the 2016 finals—just two fewer than the total number of female finalists in the previous six years.

A Division runner-up **Anthony Daniels II** is just 14, and his finals future looks bright. ... Dustin Mahmot bowled in his fourth finals in the past five years. ... The "Rise from the Dead Award" goes to Herman Lee III. Doubt me? Carefully review the "Position-By-Round" section on page 13. ... For the first time since 2006, there were no ties in any of the finals matches.

Kolessides was the only bowler to average over 200. Last year, 13 of 24 finalists topped the 200 mark. ... Why? This was the first year a Sport Bowling lane condition was used. Said Tournament Manager Kenny Robinson: "It was the 2008 Teen Masters long pattern, a 42foot pattern that was kind of narrow in the middle and challenging on the outside. So they had to play a little bit more of a direct line and hit their mark more consistently instead of throwing it outside and watching it come back off the dry area. It was a lot nicer to see that some of these people were appreciative of the challenging shot and the idea of the results showing how close they were in averages and how low they were compared to years past that also made it more rewarding."

Watch for changes in what has been the "Alumni Invitational" that will permit many more bowlers to participate.

She has qualified for National Junior Gold competition in Detroit, Buffalo, and Chicago and qualified for this year's event in Indianapolis. Cayla

also bowls in any tournament that she can. She bowls in the NCAUSBCA Youth Championship Tournament, 600 Club tournaments, Vern Burke tournaments, Invitational tournament, Virginia Games tournaments, and any local tournaments that the centers may have.

Cayla participates in numerous community service activities that involve bowling, and when needed, she often works with the younger bowlers. She helps with the Have-a-Ball program at Bowl America Manassas and also at school fairs in the bowling booth. She volunteers with the Special Olympics Area 23 bowling program, and when working with these groups, she stresses that bowling is a fun game and not to get upset with yourself if you are bowling badly.

A few coaches run a program called "Road to Gold" to help youth bowlers with their mental and physical aspects to the game. She has been in the group for four years with about 30 other youths.

While engaged with all of these activities, she maintains a 3.7 GPA as a junior at Osbourn High School in the biotech program.

He also is a part of Steppin' Up to Chicago and Filipino Strength Bowling Concepts.


Brandon's highest youth league average of 214 is commendable for someone of his age. His highest game is a 299 and highest set is 731, as he continues to perfect his game.

# Kegel Company thoughts, the two-handed style, and more

**Q.** I have read that the Kegel Company does much more for bowling than make oiling machines. Do you have any insight on what else Kegel offers to bowlers?

**A.** Yes! Two years ago, I visited the Kegel Training Center in Lake Wales, Florida. This is also the location of the Kegel factory for making the oiling machines. They have a state-of-the-art training center with a unique set of lanes that can be tweaked to different topographical conditions. They can read the lanes where you bowl and almost

exactly set up those conditions at their center.

They have a staff of world class instructors, and they have a CATS system on each pair. CATS is Computer Aided Tracking System. They also have video capabilities on each lane. It is an awesome place to break down your game and learn how to improve. They do group lessons and individual lessons. They can set up the lanes with any oiling pattern you want to bowl on or learn.

They have a pro shop and lunch counter. If you are serious about your game, this is a serious place to learn. For information and prices and also for learning articles, go to their Web site at www.kegeltrainingcenter.com. You can also access videos from Kegel by searching "Kegel bowling" on YouTube. They have done many great learning videos.

**Q.** I am new to the sport and have just joined a mixed league the season. I am a male and throw a straight 12-pound house ball. My teammates are after me to get my own ball. They said to get a reactive urethane ball and have the pro shop guy drill it to hook so I can get higher scores. What do you think about a new ball?

**A.** Getting your own ball is a good idea, but there is more to this than having the pro shop drill it to hook. First, consider the weight—12 pounds for a man is very light. A heavier ball would help to knock down more pins.

A reactive ball is fine, but the pro shop folks cannot just drill it to hook. If you throw a straight ball, no matter what the pro shop does, it will still go straight.

So first ask the pro shop operator to watch you bowl to determine what might be the best ball for you to purchase. He or she might suggest a few lessons for you to improve your game. If you really want to get better, this is a great idea. How far you want to go to improve is your choice, but the ball alone will not make you a better bowler. It can help, but it is just one piece of the puzzle.

**Q.** There has been a lot of controversy about the two-handed style lately, with some saying it is unfair. What is your take?



"Manipulation of a bowler's average is a serious issue in the sport and something USBC plans to aggressively address at the Open Championships," USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy said. "Adding a new division to the event can only be successful by also addressing the integrity of the averages used."

Key changes in the 2017 average rules include requiring participants to use their highest average from the following sources:

- > Open Championships tournament average based on most recent 27 games since 2008 adjusted utilizing the USBC Sport Average Adjustment
- > Past three seasons of USBC certified league play.
- > Any league average reported as a Sport or Challenge league will be adjusted utilizing the USBC Sport Average Adjustment Scale.

Any bowler found using an average below the player's ability will be disqualified and subject to suspension charges initiated by USBC under USBC Rule 17a, Grounds for Disciplinary Action – Unfair Tactics.

"These rule changes will represent a major shift in the culture of average integrity enforcement at the USBC Open Championships," Murphy said. "When we catch people attempting to manipulate the system, they will be disqualified and subject to the most severe penalties available under USBC rules."

To provide participants the information they need to report the proper entering average, a new version of "Find a Member" on BOWL.com now is available. The new version includes a section for "Championship Average" that displays the Open Championships tournament average based on the most recent 27 games since 2008 adjusted utilizing the USBC Sport Average Adjustment Scale. Bowlers should use the Sport Adjusted Average for the 2017 USBC Open Championships if it is the highest average available.

Based on tournament average, historical data shows about 20 percent of Classified Division bowlers should be in the Standard Division, while five percent of those with entering averages in the Standard Division range should be in the Regular Division.

"We recognize the new rules will require extra planning for captains and some people or teams will move up in division," Murphy said. "We believe when bowlers step back and look at the big picture, these rules will be a reason to celebrate a better future for the sport as we protect the integrity of the tournament and set an example for other events to follow."

# ASK BOB, from page 18

**A.** My take is very simple: There are no rules for throwing the ball except that you must stay with the same hand-right or left. Some say that this is right and left at the same time. Not really; if you watch closely, you will see that at release most throw the ball with just one hand. Most don't use the thumb, so they are able to create much more power due to the revolutions they can produce.

But with that, also comes problems-more hook to control for one. And they still have to spare.

When bowling first started, bowlers only used two-fingered balls the thumb and the middle finger. Then it went to three fingers. I use four fingers.

We went through the period of palming and just using the fingers with no thumb. Two-handed bowling is not going to go away, so get used to it. Both two-handed and traditional bowlers will have their days, good and bad.
