Secretary of the Year Award nominations accepted until December 10

To All League Presidents and Fellow League Members: Is your league secretary worthy of recognition from the association? If so, consider submitting a nomination for "NCA-USBCA League Secretary of the Year" for this individual.

League members should know (1) if league rules were distributed following the organizational meeting; (2) if awards were received for all local and national accomplishments; and (3) if NCAUSBCA-sponsored events were promoted during the season, such as its tournaments, the Hall of Fame Celebration, and the Annual Membership Meeting.

For all nominations received, the Secretary of the Year Award Committee, in conjunction with the association office, will check to see if the secretary attended the NCA-USBCA Annual Membership Meeting and also met deadlines for: (1) league applications (making sure membership application cards were submitted with appropriate dues for all league members, including substitutes, throughout the season); and (2) final averages (with no new names added to the form—usually, the only legitimate reason to add a name is for the second average of a member who has a left- *and* right-hand average in the league).

The nomination deadline for the NCAUSBCA League Secretary of the Year Award is December 10, 2017. Nominations should be sent to secretaryoftheyear@yahoo.com or the NCAUSBCA office, addressed to the attention of the "Secretary of the Year Chair" (Cynthia Cooks, 301/659-9495).

2018 USBC OPEN ADDS EXTRA WEEK

BE RECOGNIZED AS A HALL OF FAME PATRON

With teams quickly filling the schedule for the 2018 United States Bowling Congress Open Championships in Syracuse, New York, USBC will add another week to the competition, so more bowlers can experience competing in the national event. To meet the extra requests for squad times, the 2018 USBC Open Championships will begin its run at the Oncenter Convention Center on March 24, a week earlier than previously scheduled. The 2018 tournament will last for 107 days, concluding July 8. The custom-built 48-lane venue also will play host to the USBC Masters from April 8-15, reuniting the two events for the first time since 2011. The entry deadline for the event now will be March 24 to coincide with the start of competition. It previously was listed as March 31. Captains can enter and pay online at BOWL.com/Open-Champ or call the tournament office at 888/910-2695.

Bowlers who believe they'll likely never roll a perfect game or an 800 series in NCAUSBCA-related competition so as to have their name appear in the "Association Honor Scores" section on these pages can have their name published without even rolling a bowling ball by simply becoming a Hall of Fame patron. For as little as \$10, anyone can be listed as a patron in the Hall of Fame program that will appear on tables at the October 7 gala and also in the next issue of *BOWL Magazine*. All patron checks should be made out to "NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame" and sent to the NCAUSBCA office in Largo, Md. Patron levels are \$10, \$25, \$50, and \$100 or more.

Are you ready?

The start of the winter bowling season is just around the corner for most of us. I hope everyone had an enjoyable summer and an opportunity to get in some practice sessions to sharpen their bowling game.

Are you ready to discuss your league rules or deal with rule changes needed to have your league function better than it did during the previous season? Each league bowler should be aware of last season's rules in each league bowled and be ready to discuss possible changes at the organizational meeting. If new to the league, you might want to get a copy of that league's rules prior to going to the meeting. **The idea here is to be ready.**

Did you attend your center's jamboree session to learn about the center changes for the upcoming season or the changes presented by your lane representatives from your local association, NCAUSBCA?

Are you ready to participate in your league organizational meeting? What you decide during this meeting may be with you for the rest of the season. Your vote and your voice does count at these meetings, and each of you certainly has a right to be heard.

League rules regarding absentee scores, league fees in the arrears, postponements, subs during position play, tardy bowlers, and vacancy scores must clearly be stated and understood by all. Most of these rules listed are only a few areas that have caused league problems during the bowling season. Are you ready to discuss them?

Everyone should visit the NCAUSBCA home page at ncausbca.org for a link to the current USBC rules that will save your league from having to face serious issues during the bowling season. Are you *really* ready?

This season's NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame Induction & Dinner Celebration will be held on Saturday, October 7, 2017 at the Officers Club on Joint Base Anacostia-Bolling, and this again should be a great affair. Tickets are \$50 and are available for purchase from your lane representative or at the association office in Largo, Md.

Your association has several adult and youth director positions to fill on its board of directors. A few of the board member duties include being a lane representative at assigned bowling centers, attend monthly board meetings, participate in association activities, and be a voice for members on issues. An application for these positions can be found on the ncausbca.org home page. Please submit your completed application to the association office and come join us so that your association may continue be one of the louder voices for you and your fellow members at the USBC Annual Meeting.

The new season begins

Fall leagues are starting, and for some have already begun. Where did my summer go? Geese have been flying over my house heading south for the last two weeks. I'm not sure what kind of winter we are going to have, but it may be earlier than usual if the honking means anything.

Summer 2017: Reminder that September 1 was the submission deadline for summer league averages, so all of them should be at the association office at this time.

Fall 2017: I hope you attended your league organizational meeting because that is your best chance to adopt league rules that correct situations that caused problems last season. League rules may be changed prior to the start of the schedule by a majority vote; after that, changes to the rules or approved prize list requires written consent of every team captain or designated representative. Vacancies in office shall be filled by the board (officers and team captains) of directors.

President: Must verify (do the math to determine if the funds on deposit are believable) the league's funds monthly; appoint an audit committee that will do at least one audit no later than one month before prizes are due to be distributed; and have a committee produce and get approved a prize list by the fifth week of bowling.

It is absolutely a must that you make sure the league certification, along with the funds, is submitted in a timely manner. **Your**

membership status will be in jeopardy if charges are filed against you by a league member, USBC, or the local association because money was paid in good faith and the bowler did not receive a membership or had his/her achievement not recognized.

The same applies to making sure the final averages are submitted in a timely manner. **Secretary and treasurer salaries should be withheld until their duties are fulfilled.** You can always contact the office to check on the status of your league.

Secretary: Have every member fill out a membership application and collect appropriate fees; submit the league application and cards to the association office within 30 days from the start of the league schedule; and submit awards to the association office within 20 days. As a reminder, we cannot process awards until your league has been processed, so please submit the league application promptly and review the league roster upon receipt to ensure all of your league members are correctly listed. Even bowlers who have purchased a membership online from the *BOWL.com* Web site are still required to complete and give to the secretary a membership application form in each league. Sometimes bowlers forget to associate their online membership purchase with a league or association and wind up with a duplicate membership.

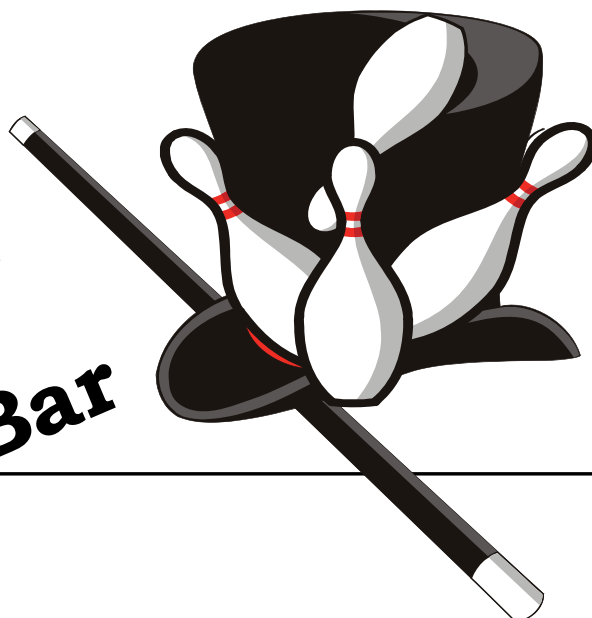

NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame to welcome Crystal Shaw-Wesby

*Induction ceremony set for October 7
at Joint Base Anacostia-Bolling*

Crystal Shaw-Wesby joined her first youth league in 1981 when she bowled in the Silver Hill Strikers league at Bowl America Silver Hill and averaged 88.



Today, she is considered one of the best women bowlers in this area, averaging 200 or better for most of the past 20 years. She has tallied three 800 series, an untold

number of 700 series, and has over 10 perfect games in USBC-certified competition. She also has been a “Top 10” area bowler, ranked No. 3 in the NCAUSBCA for the 2011-2012 season with an average of 216.7783 for 212 total games.

She rolled a 696 series while winning the Doubles category with Nichele McConnell in the NCAUSBCA 2015 Women’s Championship Tournament, an event in which Crystal has had great success:

➤ In 2009, she scored the first 800 series in the 64-year history of the tournament with her 807 at Bowl America Shirley on games of 263-289-255. Needless to say, Crystal won the Scratch Singles and also placed second in Singles. Following the tournament, she appeared on the cover of *BOWL Magazine* and was featured in the “My Stuff” segment.

➤ In 2012, she totaled a 736 series to win the Scratch Doubles with Nichele McConnell. Crystal added the Scratch All-Events crown with 2,122 — an average of 235.78 for nine games.

In other competition, she scored a 666 series and

teamed with Kevin Lomax to win the NCAUSBCA 600-700 Scratch Mixed Doubles at Bowl America Fairfax in 2007.

In the past two years at the TNBA Eastern Regional, Crystal had Scratch Doubles and Women’s Scratch Team championships. In the 2015 TNBA Nationals, she bowled on a Women’s Scratch Team winner.

She also earned titles in the following events:

- Maryland State USBC Women’s Championships — 2012 (Scratch All-Events, Scratch Team); 2013 and 2014 (Scratch Singles, Scratch Doubles, Scratch All-Events); 2015 (Scratch All-Events, Scratch Team); and 2016 (Scratch All-Events).
- 2012 Maryland State Open Championships (Doubles — first time event won by two women).
- 2014 Virginia State Women’s Tournament (Scratch All-Events, Scratch Singles, Scratch Team).
- Fredericksburg Women’s.
- Williamsburg Mixed.
- UBA Battle Bowl.

Despite her demonstrated success on the lanes, Crystal believes her greatest achievement has been giving back to youths and adults of the bowling community with one-on-one coaching. Since 2007, she has helped well over 100 individuals as well as assisted some youth leagues and bowling camps. Her main focus has been to have girls and women receive the necessary information to succeed in the sport of bowling. She then gets to enjoy the success of those she has helped.

Crystal Shaw-Wesby, an outstanding bowler who by her actions clearly has not forgotten those getting started in our sport, is a most worthy addition to the NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame.

Reggie Rich Tribute Fund tops \$7,200

Four area leagues pledge "50/50" support

As noted in the May/June issue, longtime area bowler Reginald "Reggie" Rich died in a car accident on the way home from his Monday league's final night of bowling the evening of May 8, 2017. Reggie was a very special person, large in stature at six-foot-three and 260 pounds, a kind-hearted, generous man, always smiling—truly a "gentle giant."

Anyone who knew him, knew Reggie loved children. One Wednesday night as he waited for his league to start, Reggie watched as balloons were handed out to children as a birthday party was winding down. There were a few balloons left over. Reggie noticed that a bystander, 2½-year-old Sophie Swenton, also was watching. When she wasn't offered one of the extra balloons, Reggie could see how disappointed she was. The next Wednesday, he brought a fistful of balloons to the bowling center and gave them to a very happy and appreciative Sophie—a typical Reggie move. Over the next 5½ years, it was great to observe the wonderful, special friendship between Sophie and Reggie. Several weeks before Reggie passed away, Sophie had given her friend,

a beaming "Mr. Reggie," her first-grade school picture.

After Reggie's passing, the Reggie Rich Tribute Fund (<https://www.gofundme.com/reggie-rich-tribute-fund>) was established to honor his memory. As a fitting tribute to Reggie's love of bowling, his generosity, and his love of children, the proceeds from the fund will be used to pay the league fees of area youth bowlers who could not otherwise afford to bowl in a youth league. The program will be administered through the youth leagues at Bowl America Falls Church. To date, donations total over \$7,200.

With fall leagues now forming, efforts are underway to secure future donations that will continue to be used to support the youth leagues at Bowl America Falls Church. So far, the first four leagues approached—Club 55, First Niters, Falls Church Commercial, and Senior Mixed Gray—have included provisions in their 2017-2018 by-laws to donate the league portion of their "50/50" proceeds, estimated in excess of \$2,000, to Reggie's tribute fund. What a great way to honor Reggie's legacy.

But then, it also strikes me as a great potential investment in the future of bowling. What does your league do with its 50/50 money? Why not donate it as a means to grow your bowling center's youth programs? After all, today's youth are the key to the future of our sport.

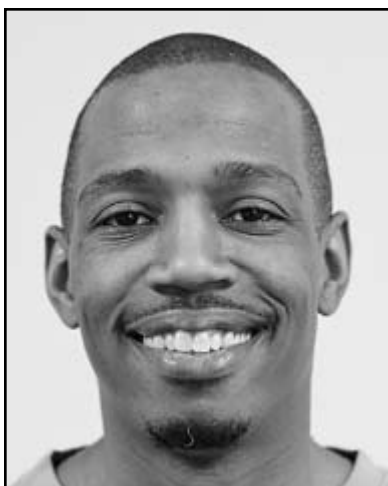

To be eligible for the rankings, a youth must bowl a minimum of 60 total games. The divisions are determined by the youth bowler's age as of July 31 of the current bowling season. Youths who bowl exclusively in leagues in "self-processing" centers are not eligible for the rankings.



Blue oil, “over/under” reactions

Q. Now that it has been done for awhile, what are your thoughts, likes, or dislikes about the blue oil being used for some of the TV matches?

A. I think it is good for the PBA overall, especially to attract new viewers. We bowlers understand there are oil patterns on the lanes, but newer bowlers don't always know about oil and how it affects their game.

Watching the pros bowling with the blue oil on the lanes shows them and us how the pattern breaks down with traffic. I like seeing how the pattern changes and

what changes the best players in the world make to keep their scoring level up ... also, what happens when they don't make the proper change. For me, it makes the show way more interesting.

Q. I am a 185-average bowler, and during one of our league sessions that wasn't going so well, our best bowler said the lanes were “under/over.” What does this mean? What is the cause of under/over? How can it be best dealt with?

A. Wow! This is a great question

and a bit of a tough one. I might leave something out, so if I do, I want to ask you, my readers, to let me know your thoughts on this subject.

First question, *over/under* is a ball reaction that means one time you throw the ball and it goes light; you then try to make a move and go through the nose. Make another small move, and it's the nose again. Another small move and miss the headpin. You are dealing with *over/under*.

The cause can be many things, and this is why *over/under* can be very frustrating. It can be the oil pattern, and you are lined up wrong. It can be your speed—you need more or less of it. It can be the ball you are using, and maybe the cover stock of that ball or the balance of that ball is just not matching up to the oil pattern. It can be that you are just out of time or trying too hard that day. It can be that you are overturning the ball or turning too early (chicken winging).

As for solutions, first you have to try to get a handle on what might be causing it on this day. If everyone is having this problem, it might well be the oil pattern that day, and it is just plain tougher than usual. For this, you will have to try to make good shots and stay relaxed. If it is just you, ask someone to watch to see if you might be turning the ball over or turning too early.

If you have been bowling well lately and you just can't get anything to work, try changing balls. Also, with the change of ball, you might have to change your line on the lanes. It takes a little experimenting and some knowledge of your own game, so more practice is very important.

Here is an example of what happened to me in a recent tournament: Practice shots went great, but after about half of the first game, I began to get a huge *over/*

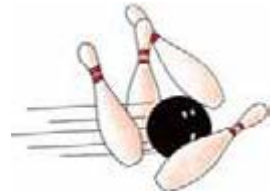

under reaction. Knowing I had been bowling well as of late, I tried changing balls. No help. I had three not-so- good games and was lost.

Then it hit me: All this time, my move on the lanes had been small, a board or two. So I made a large move of seven boards with the feet and five with my mark. This was the solution: The lanes had transitioned, and I missed it. I shot 670 the last three games with a 250 game.

You have to keep your thinking cap on *all* the time. I was caught by the oil I could not see. I needed the blue oil!
