


- Obtained recognition of the game.
- Promoted public acceptance.
- Service to bowlers.

Bowling Achievement

- Bowling achievement.
- Image.

PBA BILLY WELU SCHOLARSHIP FOR COLLEGIATE BOWLERS

The Professional Bowlers Association **Billy Welu Scholarship** is awarded annually, recognizing exemplary qualities in male or female college students who compete in the sport of bowling. The scholarship winner receives \$1,000. To be eligible candidates must be amateur bowlers who are currently in college (preceding the application date) and maintain at least a 2.5 GPA or equivalent. The scholarship was established to annually recognize a college student who combines outstanding bowling talents with academic excellence. The late Welu was best known for his expert analysis alongside legendary ABC broadcaster and PBA Hall of Famer Chris Schenkel on the popular "Pro Bowlers Tour" series. The United States Bowling Congress is adding a week of July dates to the [2019 USBC Open Championships](#) in Las Vegas, taking the event through July 8, 2019. With more than 9,000 teams already registered to compete, the additional week was added to accommodate the increased demand. The 2019 tournament will kick off March 9 at the South Point Bowling Plaza, and the last day of team competition is set for July 7, with doubles/singles squads wrapping up the competition on July 8. Currently, the 2019 Open Championships is tracking 53 percent ahead of the 2018 tournament that was held in Syracuse, New York, and 11 percent ahead of the 2017 event, which also took place in Las Vegas. If current trends continue, the 2019 Open Championships will have more than 11,000 teams compete.

On October 15 in the Northern Virginia Scratch Classic league at Uptown Alley IV in Manassas, Va., Sean Friendly recorded the center's first-ever perfect game, which was rolled on the Brunswick Japan Open lane pattern. ... The latest NCAUSBCA 2017-2018 Triple Crown Award recipients include Bowl America Woodbridge league members Johnny Gutridge Jr. (300 game / 877 series / 242 average in Friday Nite Early Mixed), Michael Herman Jr. (300 / 1,126 (four games) / 244 in 28th Annual Draft), and Deborah Smith (245 / 655 / 188 in Primetimers).

FOR THE RECORD

Diana J. White of Chesapeake, Va., has been reinstated to membership in USBC and again becomes eligible to compete in USBC leagues and tournaments with all of the attendant membership privileges.



League officers must perform their duties

We've just had the opening of another bowling season that has gone well for most of the association's leagues. League members should be aware of the duties of each member of their elected boards.

PRESIDENT

Part of your job is to enforce the rules and familiarize yourself with the changes made to the rules from the previous season.

➤ Schedule meetings at convenient times and locations for league members, and prepare an agenda of items to discuss. All issues may be voted on.

➤ Appoint committees, including the required prize and audit committees. A prize fund should be submitted by the fifth week of bowling for league members to vote on for approval.

➤ Arrange to open an account in the league's name at a federally insured and recognized bank, credit union, or in-house banking service. The president will have the monthly bank statement sent to him or herself for verification. The "President's Monthly Verification Worksheet" can be used to verify the league account monthly. Two league officers must sign for all fund withdrawals.

➤ The president is the voice of the league. This voice should be a unified voice, that of the president and with the backing of the board of directors. No one else should speak for the league, independent of the president.

SECRETARY

➤ Keeps minutes of all league meetings. Minutes should include

the meeting date, time, location, names of those attending, and details of the decisions made, including the vote count.

➤ Update the rules and distribute a copy of the league rules soon after the organizational meeting.

➤ Post the full league schedule or provide a copy for each captain. Once approved, provide a copy of the adopted prize list to each team captain and officer.

➤ Pass out individual USBC membership application cards to each league member, including all substitutes, as they join and then collect completed cards and applicable membership dues. Forward the completed membership application cards, membership dues, and USBC league application to the NCAUSBCA office within 30 days of the start of the season. Membership card applications and fees for new members shall also be forwarded to the local association office within 30 days of receipt. If bowlers indicate they have paid in another league on the membership card, request a receipt. If no receipt, collect the fees; they can be refunded upon proof of previous payment.

➤ Post or provide a current standings sheet that includes a list of league bowlers and substitutes.

➤ Submit applications for awards within 20 days of the accomplishment. **Awards presentations should take place before the entire league and as soon as possible after the feat was accomplished and the award is available.** A long delay can re-

USBC's Registered Volunteer Program adds SafeSport education requirement

ARLINGTON, Texas — Online training and education through the U.S. Center for SafeSport now is a required component of the United States Bowling Congress' Registered Volunteer Program (RVP) and, to comply with United States Olympic Committee (USOC) regulations, the program has been expanded to include local and state association board members.

The addition of SafeSport online training to the RVP process provides education about athlete safety for those who work closely with USBC Youth members. The material will help volunteers and coaches learn how to prevent abuse from happening and how to respond if abuse already has occurred. While created with youth in mind, the concepts involved also are appropriate when dealing with adults and senior citizens in our associations.

Federal legislation has been enacted to ensure the safety of athletes. Everyone deserves to participate in sports free from bullying, hazing, sexual misconduct, or any form of emotional or physical abuse. USBC, a USOC member and the National Governing Body (NGB) of bowling, stands alongside the U.S. Center for SafeSport and its commitment to this goal.

Started in 2006, RVP was put into place to ensure volunteers having regular contact with USBC Youth members were vetted through a mandatory criminal background screening in an effort to remove those who might harm children. In the fall of 2012, USBC Coaching Certification and Development made RVP a mandatory requirement for all certified coaches.

Items of interest

➤ **Summer 2018:** Reminder that summer league averages must be submitted to the association office. To date, we still have not received final averages from a number of leagues.

➤ **Fall 2018:** Sanction fees: \$24.00 for standard membership; \$11 for state and local; \$10 for local only; membership is good through summer 2019. Basic membership is only good for *one* league. As a reminder, secretaries must turn in a membership application for every member of the league, including substitutes. Ask to see their membership card or a payment stub; otherwise, they must pay the required fee, even for those who "paid online."

➤ **Awards:** Last season's championship pins have arrived, and your lane representatives should have delivered them to your center. Staff is hard at work filling award requests for this season. There is always a delay at the start of the season, as awards cannot be filled until the league has been received and processed. Award forms as well as many other forms can be found in the "Secretary's Corner" on ncausbca.org.

➤ **Membership cards:** The last membership cards should be received by December 20. If you do not get your card by then, you can check BOWL.com to see if it is there and when it was fulfilled. If you are not certified, you should give us a call at 301/499-1693 and inquire. Don't wait until the day before you leave for the tournament to wonder about your mem-

bership. Just because you started bowling in August....

➤ **Association Tournaments:** The Women's Championship will take place March 16-17 and 23-24, 2019, and the Open Championship is scheduled for April 6-7, 13-14, and 27-28, 2019. Both tournaments will feature a "Crossover Doubles" event this year. Bowlers will sign up for this event at the tournament. Also, anyone who has a local membership but may not have a local average can bowl with his/her highest average as listed on BOWL.com for the 2017-2018 season.

➤ **Association Updates:** Provided we have your eMail address, you should receive updates periodically. Otherwise, visit ncausbca.org regularly for news and information.

➤ **Association Annual Membership Meeting:** February 24, 2019 ... see page 7. This is your opportunity to let the board know what kind of program you expect and to let your delegates to the state and national conventions know what message they should deliver to the respective organizations on your behalf. You may also be interested in joining the board. If so, your candidate form must be received by December 31, 2018 to have your name placed on the ballot.

➤ **Hall of Fame:** Candidate résumés must be received by December 31, 2018.

Let us all try to have some fun bowling this season.







Currently, USBC board and International Bowling Campus Youth Committee members, USBC employees, Team USA and Junior Team USA support staff, and team members, local and state youth association and committee members, association managers, youth league officials, and USBC-certified coaches all are required to hold RVP approval.

With all associations merged, RVP approval now will be required of every state and local board member, every youth committee member and youth director, plus all USBC Youth tournament managers. Each person is required to complete the training process by Jan. 1, 2019. USBC will send notification to those required to hold RVP approval with information on how to properly register for the training.

Anyone who currently holds RVP certification will need to complete the required online SafeSport training by Jan. 1, 2019. There is no cost for the online training, and it can be accessed 24 hours a day. USBC members and USBC-certified coaches should go through BOWL.com/RVP to access the SafeSport training and to provide their USBC national ID when registering for training.

For anyone seeking to complete the RVP process, they first must complete the SafeSport education. Once USBC receives notification a person has completed SafeSport training, it will direct the applicant to complete the background screening portion through the National Center for Safety Initiatives (NCSI).

The NCSI background check process also is done online, and NCSI charges a fee of \$21.25 to cover its costs to perform the required checks. The fee might be higher in states that require additional fees to access its data.

duce a bowler's excitement about earning awards and his/her appreciation of membership benefits.

- Notify league members of league and association meetings.
- Provide the final league standings to the league treasurer so that prizes can be properly distributed and reported with the financial report.
- Submit season-ending averages to NCAUSBCA, as this is how averages are uploaded to BOWL.com.
- Keep all correspondence and records, and furnish all league property to the incoming secretary upon election or upon completion of league business.
- Notify the association of any changes in officers, schedules, or bowling centers.

TREASURER

The treasurer is responsible for all league receipts and disbursements.

- Disbursements from the account must have two signatures. If you are using an in-center banking service, the treasurer is responsible for all duties specified in USBC Rule 102f (if unfamiliar with the rule, please look it up).
- Work with the president to open an account in the league's name at an insured bank, credit union, or in-house banking service. Disbursements must have two signatures. Statements are mailed to the president for verification.
- The president will meet with the treasurer at least once monthly to verify the league account balance.
- Issue a check or money order within 30 days made payable to "NCAUSBCA" to cover membership dues.
- Prepare a budget for the prize committee so they will know how much money is available for disbursement.
- Provide audit committee with information needed to perform a proper audit, including, but not limited to, account statement, team payment envelopes, and expense and deposit receipts.
- Provide financial reports on request by the league president or board.
- At season's end, provide each team with a detailed financial statement when the prize fund is distributed, including receipts, disbursements, and transactions, prize recipients' names, and earnings.
- Distribute the prize fund within 21 days after the league schedule ends, unless the board or USBC decides otherwise.
- Turn over all league books, papers, and monies to the next treasurer upon election or once the season's business is complete. All financial records, regardless if in the possession of the former or current treasurer, must be retained for one (1) year after the league schedule ends.
- Ensure you learn when your league's organizational meeting is and attend. This is where you get to change the rules of your league. Once the league has started, you'll need 100 percent of the membership vote to change a rule.
