Iowa bowler oldest to roll 800 series

ARLINGTON, Texas - Jim Novak of Cedar Rapids, Iowa recently made his way into the United States Bowling Congress record book as the oldest bowler to roll an 800 series. At 91 years, 2 months, and 21 days old, Novak on February 25 put together games of 279, 256, and 268 for an 803 series during the Young at Heart league. He topped the previous mark of 85 years and 9 days, set by William Lautenschlager of Stockton, California, in 2016.

Novak's score is pending formal approval from USBC and would be the 21st certified 800 of his 65-year bowling career. He last eclipsed the 800 mark in March 2010.

"Honestly, I'd given up on having another day like that because an 800 series really is hard to come by," said Novak, who also owns 35 USBC-certified perfect games.

Novak didn't start bowling until his late 20s, and his career as an auto mechanic who owned his own specialty shop limited the amount of time he spent on the lanes. After the business was established and doing well, there was more help and more time to bowl.

His first USBC-certified 300 game came in 1988 when he was 60 years old, and his first 800 came almost seven years later.

Does your league have any prize fund issues?

Another winter season is almost at an end for most bowlers, and we have again been spared by Mother Nature the wrath of winter snow, at least in our area anyway. Not so good if you live in Chicago as I once did ... brrr!

A frequently asked question: *Is a bowler who quit the league entitled to a prize share?* Answer: It depends. If the bowler left the league in good standing, then he/she is entitled to a share of the prize.

Leagues should always have an audit done within the last month of the season to avoid nasty surprises come payoff time.

Another question: *The prize fund is short due to bowler arrears, so how do we calculate the team prize payout?* The payout will most likely have to be done on a percentage basis if it is too late to get the bowler(s) to make the required payments.

An audit would have discovered the shortage. Leagues should always have an audit done within the last month of the season to avoid nasty surprises come payoff time. You can check the "Secretary's Corner" section on our site for sample forms and procedures for audits and financial statements.

Please remember to certify your mid-season leagues and send in the membership cards so that everyone can be counted. Basic membership is still \$11.00, and bowlers are required to pay

a Basic membership fee for every Basic league. The best value is to pay \$24 and have the ability to bowl in multiple leagues at no extra cost, and this includes the summer as well.

Final averages are the *league secretary's* responsibility—not the bowling center's. Fillable final average forms are available on request, just eMail *bowlmag@hotmail.com* to request a form.

We recently had our Annual Membership Meeting where

the USBC-proposed amendments to the rules, bylaws, and tournaments were discussed. A list of the amendments and the decisions made by those who attended appears on page 10.

Want a really good value? Bowl in our upcoming NCAUSBCA 74th Annual Open Championship Tournament. A new offering this season is the Crossover Doubles, where you can bowl with as many partners as you wish and increase your chances of getting a check. Participants must bowl on the same doubles squad to participate.

No hotel stay is required, and the prize payout ratio is better than most.

13th Annual Membership Meeting

Butler elected fifth vice president; Mayes, Franklin continue as veeps

Zone Holland to join board as a youth director

Nation's Capital Area USBC Association (NCAUSBCA) members attending the 13th Annual Membership Meeting held February 24 at the NCAUSBCA office building in Largo, Md., elected Darron Mayes, Waldorf, Md., and Dwight Franklin, Largo, to respective two-year terms as first and third vice president. Both were elected by acclamation. In a contest for fifth vice president between two directors, James Butler, Mitchellville, Md., defeated Jane Andrews of the District.

Directors elected to a two-year term ending July 31, 2021 include Jane Andrews; Luis Drakes, Laurel, Md.; Michael Jordan, Upper Marlboro, Md.; Ken Larkin, Alexandria, Va.; Gene Mays and Nannette White, D.C.; Brenda McDowell and

Kirk Williams, District Heights, Md.; Greta Nettles Pearson, Fort Washington, Md.; Evan Ruffini, Ashburn, Va.; James B. Stewart, Hyattsville, Md.; and Samuel Wolde, Waldorf, Md.

On a separate ballot, the members elected four youth directors to two-year terms: Ja'Sean Billings, Suitland, Md.; David DeBat, Warrenton, Va.; Lorenzo "Zone" Holland, Chesapeake Beach, Md.; and Robin Hollyfield, Manassas, Va.

Terms for those elected begin August 1.

Individuals elected via separate ballot to serve as delegates to the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) 2020 Annual Meeting include Andre Andrews, D.C.; Jane Andrews; Robert Ashley III, Centreville, Va.; Phyllis Bourque, La Plata,

Md.; James Butler; Ronald McGregor, Temple Hills, Md.; and Evan Ruffini.

On another separate ballot, Robert Ashley III; Ja'Sean Billings; Andrea Dale, Stafford, Va.; David DeBat; Willie H. Graves Jr., Mitchellville, Md.; and Ronald McGregor were elected to serve as delegates to the Fall 2019 and Spring 2020 meetings of the Virginia State USBC.

Director Adam Mitchell led a discussion of the proposed amendments that will be voted on at the USBC Annual Meeting this April in Las Vegas, Nev. (The amendment summaries as well as the desires expressed by the USBC board and NCAUSBCA members on the legislation appear on page 10.)

Immediately prior to the meeting's adjournment, Sharon Brown made a motion that the association pay all bills. It was seconded by Lorenzo "Zone" Holland and passed by the members.

Once again, there were several fund-raising contests. Nannette White and James Butler won 50/50 drawings. A total of \$88 was collected for Ways and Means, while \$56 was received for BVL.

Meanwhile, \$130 was collected in ticket sales for the May 2019 Virginia Lottery "Pick 3" game.







Tweeti Barnett-Johnson selected "NCAUSBCA 2017-2018 Secretary of the Year"

At the NCAUSBCA 13th Annual Membership Meeting on February 24, Brenda "Tweeti" Barnett-Johnson of the Wednesday AM Retirees league at Crofton Bowling Centre, was honored as "NCAUSBCA 2017-2018 Secretary of the Year" for the impeccable service she rendered her league last season. Association office staffer Tena Boone said, "She's very efficient: In fact, her league's award applications usually arrive by the next morning." In addition, Tweeti offered outstanding support of NCAUSBCA functions and events: She attended the Hall of Fame Induction & Dinner Celebration and the 2018 Annual Membership Meeting, and she participated in the Senior Tournament, the Mixed Tournament in Support of BVL, and the Women's Championship Tournament, where her "Sassy But Classy Ladies 6" team captured top honors.



20th Annual Guys & Dolls Tournament Rules

1. The Tournament is open to any bowler providing proof of a 2018-2019 USBC Membership and book average from the prior 2 seasons, or a final 2018-2019 league standings sheet if no prior years.
2. Bowlers must present a USBC membership card at the tournament check-in **30 minutes prior** to scheduled start time. Lineup will be as shown on entry form. Teams or bowlers failing to appear on the lanes, prepared to bowl at the scheduled time, shall forfeit their entry unless sufficient reason is given to warrant postponement.
3. Bowlers entered in the singles event must also enter the doubles event and visa-versa.
4. The Team captain, or his legal representative, has the privilege of substituting other bowlers for those originally entered. Only same sex substitutions will be accepted. In the doubles event, the names of both entrants must be given. Entries with the word "**PARTNER**" will not be accepted. Each Team MUST consist of 2 Men and 2 Women, and Doubles MUST consist of 1 Male and 1 Female.
5. The Doubles event will be bowled immediately following the Singles event. **SINGLES is Bowled First**.
6. All entrants will bowl 3 games on one pair of lanes in each event, unless mechanical failures dictate otherwise. No entry money will be refunded if it is discovered that a team or individual has failed to comply with all rules of the United States Bowling Congress and all rules and requirements of this tournament.
7. **Handicap will be 90% of the difference between the bowler's entering average and a scratch figure of 230** All handicaps will be calculated on a 3 game basis. It shall be the responsibility of each bowler to verify his or her average. Failure to use proper average shall disqualify scores bowled if submitted average is lower than actual average. Prize winnings will be based on submitted average if it is higher than the actual average. Average corrections must be made prior to the completion of the FIRST GAME.
8. **ENTERING AVERAGE:** Your Highest USBC Average over the past 2 years. If your average this season is 10 or more pins higher than the last 2 seasons, this year's average will be used. USBC RULE 319a(2) WILL APPLY. 10 PIN RULE
9. If a bowler does not have an yearbook average for the last 2 years, the bowler may use the highest current certified average (of 21 or more games) as of the closing date for entries of the tournament (**May 25, 2019**), otherwise they must enter with an average of 230. If using current average, a league sheet showing average as of May 25, 2019 must be provided to Tournament Officials at check-in or emailed with entry form. **If bowler does not have a yearbook or current average and competed in a summer league, that average, of at least 21 games, may be used provided it is verified at the tournament office. USBC Rules 319 c, d, & e will apply.**
10. The prize ratio for each event will be one prize for each five entries. Lineage and Expense = \$12.50, Prize Money = \$12.50 per bowler per handicap event. PRIZE MONEY WILL BE RETURNED 100%.
11. In the event of a tie for first place (team, doubles, singles) the tied contestants will bowl 3 games in accordance with the rules of the tournament at such time and place as decided by the Tournament Manager. Total pins, including handicap, for the 3 games will determine the winner. In the event of a tie for first place in the All Events, USBC Rule 326a will apply. When there is a tie for any championship in a tournament, it is optional with tournament management to have a playoff or declare co-champions.
12. Entrants must report any previous tournament prize winnings in the last year of \$ 600.00 or more in total. If entrant has won \$600.00 or more in total prize winnings for a tournament, he/she must submit all his/her tournament scores and winnings PRIOR TO BOWLING. USBC Rule 319e
13. **PARTICIPATION & DRESS CODE RULES**
 - a. All Bowlers must wear shirts with collars or MOCK Collars, **NO EXCEPTIONS!!.**
 - b. **NO T-SHIRTS may be worn on the lanes.**
 - c. **NO CLOTHES WITH HOLES may be worn on the lanes.**
 - d. Bowlers may enter doubles 2 times as long as partners change. Bowlers may only cash once in scratch singles, (Highest Score). Bowlers may enter the team event 3 times, as long as 2 members of the team change.
 - e. Only one professional (PBA or PWBA) member allowed per doubles pair, and only 2 per team.
14. Scores lost due to malfunction of automatic scorers shall be re-bowled if the scores can not be verified by other scoring means.
15. Scores for ALL-EVENTS will be taken from the FIRST series bowled in each event. (Team, Doubles, & Singles)
16. USBC Rule 330 will apply. (A bowler must use the same hand to deliver the bowling ball throughout the tournament).
17. USBC Rule 329, a protest or appeal involving eligibility or playing rules must be filed with Tournament Management, the Local Association or USBC up to 5 Days before tournament prizes are paid. The protest or appeal must be in writing and the grounds for the protest or appeal briefly stated.
18. **A \$ 20.00 ADMINISTRATIVE FEE, PLUS BANK CHARGES WILL BE LEVIED ON ANY RETURNED CHECKS.**
19. **SCRATCH EVENTS:** Bowlers must compete in regular tournament to enter scratch event. Scores from handicap event will be used to determine winners of the scratch event.

Through all these achievements, he was nominated to join the National Society of High School Scholars.

Garrett shows heavy interest in giving back to his community by volunteering at a local soup kitchen for the homeless whenever he is able. He helps there not because he has to but because he likes seeing the joy in people's eyes as he watches them receive the service.

Garrett also is a member of the NCAUSBCA Youth Committee. Being a part of this committee, he gets a say in meetings and all discussions that have to do with the youth, as he is a youth representative. He also takes part in helping run local tournaments when he is available and not bowling.

Garrett started to bowl at the age of 2½. He has had a strong love for the sport ever since he picked

Let's keep things fair and honest

Many of us enjoy entering our league's jackpot games, and we always expect those games to be run fairly and honestly. Unfortunately, sometimes the people who run the games may need to be reminded that these events are for the *bowlers* and not the personal enrichment of the person running the games.

What am I talking about?

Well, I have noticed that in a few in-league jackpot games, the person who was declared the winner of the game had the highest game score but had

never actually entered the jackpot. However, the crooked person who collected declared this "non-entrant" the jackpot winner and then paid a little something to that "declared winner" while pocketing the rest of the winnings.

Meanwhile, the poor person who had actually paid to enter the jackpot and had bowled the highest score among the true entrants got nothing—zippo, nada, zilch!

Now how is that fair?

The answer is: It is *not* fair.

On a different but similar note, I asked some good bowlers why they hadn't entered a local tournament. They said because other bowlers were allowed to enter the tournament *without having to pay the entry fee.*

What!?

The tournament director allowed certain bowlers to enter as many times as they wish *for free.* They then have some sort of payout later.

Now how is that fair to those who enter and pay every time?

The answer is: It is *not* fair.

Personally, I happen to be a big fan of in-league jackpots, and I love local tournaments, but I also think that sometimes the people running the events need to be gently reminded to stay honest and to run things fairly.

While he loves to bowl, he also loves to assist anyone who needs help.

Garrett Meadows is a worthy recipient of the NCAUSBCA Ted Gruszkowski Jr. Youth Star Award, not only for his accomplishments on the lanes and in the community but also because he is a kind, loving, and well-rounded individual with a great passion for the sport of bowling.

USBC Open Championships to adjust squad schedules starting in 2020

ARLINGTON, Texas – Starting with the 2020 event, the United States Bowling Congress will adjust the number of squads for the Open Championships to provide competitors with additional options for Doubles/Singles competition.

At the 2020 Open Championships, only four bowlers will compete on each pair during Doubles/Singles (D/S) squads. The change will reduce the time needed to complete a squad, allowing the Open Championships to have four D/S squads, instead of the current three.

In addition to starting (7 a.m.) and ending the day (11:45 p.m.), D/S squads also will take place at 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. under the new schedule. Team squads will be at 1 p.m. and 8 p.m., starting with the 2020 event.

The change is in response to the results of an Open Championships survey, in which more than 53 percent of the bowlers said having to bowl an early or late D/S squad was a significant problem for their team. The current schedule has just one D/S squad (2:30 p.m.) that is deemed a desirable timeslot, and it quickly fills up.

“Moving to four D/S squads, with four bowlers on each pair, will allow more competitors to bowl a D/S squad at a more desirable time,” Open Championships Tournament Director Duane Hagen said. “This will help for better scheduling, as teams can match their early or

late team competition date with an early or late D/S date, and should help in the management of the tournament overall.”

With the change, USBC will be able to offer more than half of the competitors a midday D/S timeslot. Currently, only about one-third of the bowlers are able to compete midday. Despite the last D/S squad of the day having a later start in 2020, the squad is expected to finish at an earlier time since there are fewer bowlers on each pair.

The new schedule also should assist in keeping squads on time, as there will be additional time between squads for lane conditioning, squad announcements, and the march out.




