The Best Bowling Tip I've Ever Received

The best bowling tip I've ever received came from area bowler Lamont Bush back in 1998. We were at Bowl America Shirley, and a lot of bowlers were asking me why I drift so much and how I could stop drifting.

When I did try to stop, it was changing my whole game. Bush told me, "There is no right or wrong way to bowl; anything can work if you are able to repeat it often enough. Do what works for you and feels the most comfortable."

Because of his advice, I never tried to correct my seven-board drift. Instead, I just tried to master it and match it with angles of the lane and the breakpoint of my equipment.

Since that time, I have averaged 215-230 for the last 10 years and have always made myself competitive in whatever or wherever I bowled.
