

FAIR LANES OPENS 32-LANE CENTER IN WALDORF, MARYLAND

Fair Lanes, Inc., the country's largest independent bowling chain, has opened a 32 lane center in Waldorf, Maryland, a suburban community southeast of Washington, D.C. Fair Lanes Waldorf, located on U.S. 301 and Action Lane, celebrated its Grand Opening on Saturday and Sunday, August 27 and 28, 1977.

The Grand Opening events were highlighted with the "First Game of Spare Time Bowling Free" on Saturday and Sunday. "Youth Registration Day" was held Saturday along with an introduction to the Fair Lanes "Rent-A-Lane" Program starting Saturday

night with "Midnight Madness", Sunday morning with "Early Bird Special" and later Sunday morning with "Family Special".
