# Chapter 24: Average Recognition Committee (08/19/2018) 

### 24.1 Purpose

To recognize high average achievement of the top 10 NCAUSBCA male and female adult bowlers in three "Official Average Leaders" categories: Sport League, Challenge League, and House League. Averages will be based on 66 or more games bowled in a certified leagues and a minimum of 3 games bowled in the NCAUSBCA Championship Tournament(s) during the current bowling season. To recognize high average achievement of the top 5 NCAUSBCA male and female youth bowlers by age division in three "Official Average Leaders" categories: Sport League, Challenge League, and House League. Youth averages will be based on 36 or more games bowled in a certified leagues.

### 24.2 Eligibility and criteria

### 24.2.1 Adult

- Three "Official Average Leaders" categories: Sport League, Challenge League, House League.
- Participation in a minimum of three (3) games in the current season's NCAUSBCA Open Championship Tournament (men's requirement) or NCAUSBCA Women's Championship Tournament (women's requirement) will qualify a member for recognition consideration in that season.
- $\quad$ Only members with 66-game (minimum) league averages will be considered for recognition in a category.
- Members can receive recognition in one, two, or all three categories.


### 24.2.2 Youth

- Three "Official Average Leaders" categories: Sport League, Challenge League, House League.
- Only members with 36-game (minimum) league averages will be considered for recognition in a category
- Divisions are as follows
- Bantams: 8 years of age and younger
- Preps: 9 to 11 years of age
- Juniors: 12 to 14 years of age
- Majors/Seniors: 15 to 19 years of age
- The Divisions are determined by the youth bowler's age as of August 1 of the current bowling season.
- Members can receive recognition in one, two, or all three categories.


### 24.3 Duties

The lists of Top 10 adult male and female bowlers in each of the "Official Average Leaders" categories as well as the top 5 youth male and female bowlers in each of their divisions will be sent to the BOWL Magazine editor, the Public Relations Committee, and posted on the NCASBCA Web site.

### 24.3.1 Adult

The committee will consider for each "Official Average Leaders" category the 10 highest qualified averages as submitted by league secretaries and compute the average to 4 decimal places (e.g. 195.1234). The computed averages will be the averages listed in each category.

### 24.3.2 Youth

The committee will consider for each "Official Average Leaders" category the 5 highest qualified averages as submitted by league secretaries and compute the average to 4 decimal places (e.g. 195.1234). The computed averages will be the averages listed in each category.
