

In Round 4 at AMF Laurel, A Division leader Jarrett DeFalco tallied only 594 for his first three and watched Tyler Gray move into first after scoring 243. With agonizing second-place finishes in 2014 and 2015 and a disappointing fifth last year, was yet more Invitational frustration in store for DeFalco? Not this time: He got lined up and took control, blasting a 278 (above) and turning a 21-pin deficit into a 61-pin lead that he would not relinquish.





A confident DeFalco averaged over 227 in the final round at Bowl America Chantilly and was never really challenged, winning his first Invitational title by 153 pins in his final year of eligibility.
